Sugar Creek miner takes life; was charged with felonies

Calhoun--Felonies charges were still pending against Darrell Ellis in McLean District Court when the Sacramento man shot and killed himself Wednesday, Sept. 8 after attempting to shoot his wife, court officials said.

Ellis was charged with first degree sodomy and kidnapping. His case was bound over to the grand jury in Calhoun Friday after a preliminary hearing was held in District Court, McLean Circuit Clerk Linda McClure said.

Mrs. McClure and McLean County Attorney Connie Revelett declined to discuss the case Thursday, since District Judge Charles Ehlschide imposed a gag order Friday.

Ehlschide gave no official reason for the order, Mrs. McClure said. She, Miss Revelett and Commonwealth Attorney Dan Cornette said they are unsure whether the gag order is still in effect, despite Ellis' death.

Ellis died Wednesday of a self-inflicted gunshot wound after he opened fire on Mrs. Ellis and members of her family working in a tobacco field on the Adams Schoolhouse Road three miles west of Sacramento, according to Kentucky

State Police.

He wounded his estranged wife, Mrs. Gwendolyn Ellis and her father, James Cartwright, then shot himself, police said.

He was pronounced dead on the scene by McLean County Coroner Mike Muster.

Mrs. Ellis was listed in stable condition Thursday evening at the Regional Medical Center in Madisonville.

Cartwright was treated and released from the hospital Wednesday.

With Ellis' death, the charges against him "just evaporated," Cornette said. "As far as I'm concerned, that's the end of that."

Born in Alton, Ill. June 4, 1938, he was employed at Sugar Creek Mine in Muhlenberg, and was a member of Towers Chapel Methodist Church.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Gwendolwyn Ellis of Sacramento Route 1; two daughters, Darlene Ellis and Vicky Ellis of Sacramento; sister, Mrs. Donna Adkins of Sacramento Route 1.

Funeral services were held Saturday at 2 p.m. at the Tucker Memorial Chapel in Sacramento.

The bodies were reportedly found beside a car with an empty gas tank but the ignition key still on.

They died accidentally of carbon monoxide poisoning, a Henderson coroner has ruled.

Deputy coroner Dale Pyle said "there were no indications of foul play" in the deaths of Mr. and Mrs. Ellis.

Pyle said, however, that laboratory tests will be conducted at the state police crime lab in Madisonville, and a police investigation is continuing.

Ellis was a Korean War veteran, and a member of Staney Masonic Lodge, Henderson Shrine Club, Rizpah Club, Rizpah Shrine, and

Moose Lodge 732. He was a former Henderson County deputy sheriff and ranger at the Audubon State Park.

Mrs. Ellis owned and operated Betty Alward Ellis Bookkeeping Service.

Mr. Ellis is survived by a daughter, Miss Della Ellis of Tulsa, Okla.; son, Robert of Baskett; sister, Mrs. Polly Orcutt of Worthington, Ohio.

COURT OF APPEALS UPHOLDS VERDICT IN ELLISON CASE

**Was Convicted Of Murder Of His
Young Wife Whose Body Was
Found In Mud River**

HE IS IN EDDYVILLE PRISON

The court of appeals Tuesday upheld the death sentence of Raymond Ellison, convicted Muhlenberg county child-bride slayer. The girl's body was found in Mud River in April, 1948, three months after Ellison, 37, married her. The wedding took place shortly before her 12th birthday.

Her mother, Mrs. Harrison Shins, and Muhlenberg County Attorney Russell O'Neill testified Ellison avoided prosecution for rape—carrying either a life term or death penalty—by marrying Imogene.

Other witnesses testified Ellison had declared he was "going to get rid of her. Dr. Herman S. Parish testified her skull had been fractured by a blow, but that a rag tied tightly around her neck strangled her. There was no water in her lungs to indicate drowning, he declared. drowning, he declared.

Chief Justice Porter Sims commented in the majority opinion that while "the evidence was wholly circumstantial," it was supported by testimony of Ellison's threats and of incriminating conduct. Justice Sims declared the testimony as to the forced marriage was admissible because it showed a motive for the slaying.

Judges Gus Thomas, Roy Helm and Thomas J. Knight joined in the majority opinion. Judges C. B. Latimer and James W. Cammack announced their dissent, without writing their views. Judge W. H. Rees was absent when the court took a vote.

Ellison was tried and convicted at the September, 1948, term of the Muhlenberg circuit court. Following his conviction, he was taken to the Eddyville penitentiary and is there now.

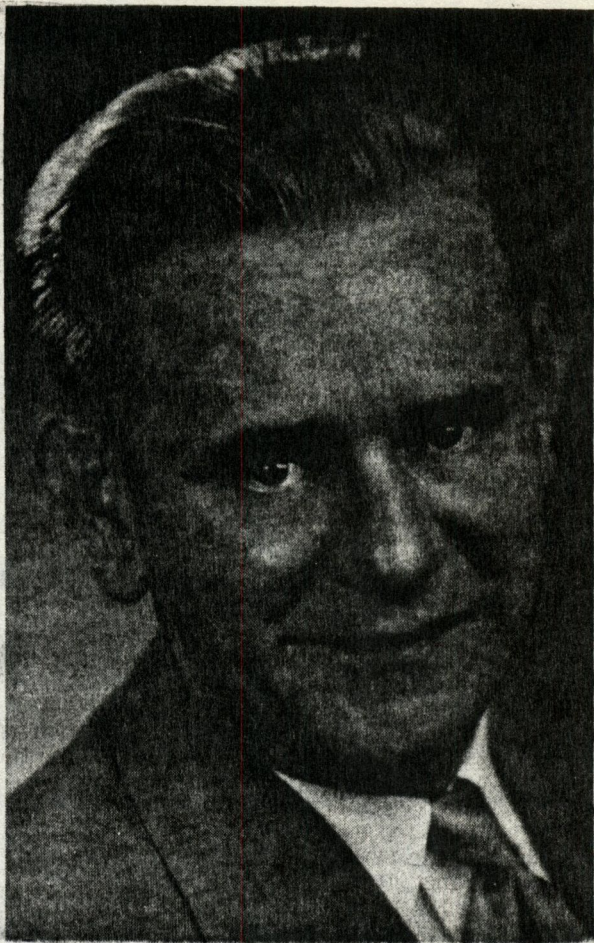

Kirk Stanley English, 18, Dies In 3-Car Wreck on U. S. 62

One Central City teen-age boy was killed and three others were injured in a head-on collision on Highway 62 near Chaney's Barbecue on Saturday, July 15 about 11:30 p.m.

Kirk Stanley English, 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Carlos English of Stringtown Road, was dead on arrival at the Muhlenberg Community Hospital. Muhlenberg Coroner Bobby Watkins reported that death was caused by head and chest injuries.

Young English was the first victim of an automobile accident in Muhlenberg County this year. At this time last year, seven persons had lost their lives in auto accidents here. The county had gone 233 days without a fatality.

Central City Policemen Keith Nunnley and Arvel Wood reported that the car driven by young English collided head-on with a vehicle driven by William B. McRee, 17, as the accident victim was attempting to pass another vehicle.

Robert (Bobby) Craig, 17, a passenger in the McRee car, was taken to the hospital for treatment of facial cuts and bruises. Also taken to the hospital were McRee, who received a sprained ankle and a fractured kneecap, and Mike Stewart, 18, who received minor injuries. Stewart and McRee were treated and released the night of the accident. Stewart was a passenger in the English automobile.

The report showed that the English auto sideswiped a car driven by Thomas Edward Piper, 20, of Cleaton, after which he attempted to pass another car, colliding with the oncoming McRee auto. Piper was not injured.

Muhlenberg had not had a traffic fatality since two brothers, Jerry Wayne and Freddie Gene Gossett, 22 and 18

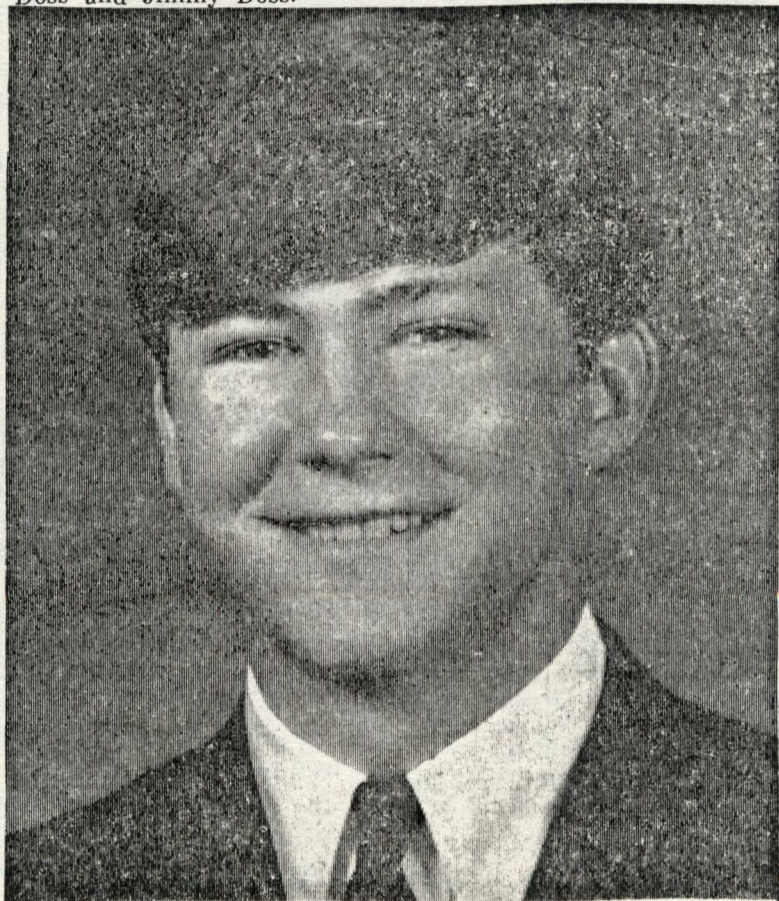
years old, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Buster Gossett of Graham, were killed instantly when their car ran head-on into a parked road grader on the new Graham-Earles highway (Ky. 175) at 9:20 a.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 23. The car was welded into the grader and a wrecker had to pull the vehicles apart. Both brothers were pinned in the car.

English was born in Muhlenberg County on March 24, 1949, and was a 1967 graduate of Muhlenberg Central High School.

Surviving besides the parents are one sister, Miss Patricia English, at home; brother, Michael English, at home; grandmother, Mrs. Martha English of Central City Route 2.

"Clarice is sick" someone at church said to me. I thought about going to see her but I already had other plans and I had no idea, no one did, how sick she really was.

One month later she was gone. I visited her several times during that month in the hospital but she had a tube in her throat and was never able to speak another word to me, or to anyone, even though she was conscious.

When I was growing up Clarice's house was my favorite place to go. Every kid in the neighborhood felt the same way. Clarice and G.T. had eight children of their own but they had big hearts and always made room for one more. Consequently, the house was always full.

I was closest in age to their oldest daughter, Sandra. Clarice was a real cut-up and she would always tease Sandra and me about our boyfriends or tell us some silly thing to try to improve our complexions, a subject we were preoccupied with anyway.

Occasionally I would get to spend the night with them and that was always such a treat. Sometimes we would get Sandra's dad, G.T., to tell us scary stories right before bedtime so we could go to bed scared. We loved it! It didn't matter to us that when we got into bed there might be one or two of the smaller children already sleeping in it. Beds, like everything else, had to be shared.

Breakfast at Clarice's house was wonderful! It was like a big feast. A typical breakfast was two dozen eggs and one or two pounds of bacon cooked different ways for different people. It would also have included a whole loaf of bread toasted or pan after pan of homemade biscuits and a big bowl of gravy.

I especially liked her homemade biscuits. For awhile we lived across the road from them and anytime she made biscuits, she would send me two or three right from the oven, hot and buttered.

With eight kids of her own, still Clarice always remembered my birthday. Just a few weeks before she died, she had slapped me on the back at church and said "I tried to call you on your birthday. Where was ya? Out running around?"

Clarice was almost always at home. You could count on it. She never belonged to any women's clubs - and never wanted to. She never learned to drive - and never wanted to. She never even went shopping much, mainly at Christmas or maybe Easter. But she could cook an egg eight different ways. She could love and cater to each of her eight children as if that was the only one she had. G.T. and the kids were her life.

I always said that Clarice could never die because her family couldn't do without her. I know its been a severe trial for them since she's been gone, especially for G.T., alone in the house for the first time in fifty years. Maybe it will help them just knowing that others still remember her often and miss her so much.

She will not be forgotten because the reverberations of her love will always be felt by those of us who visited at Clarice's house. In my mind I can hear her now, as many times in the past, saying "Love your bones."
