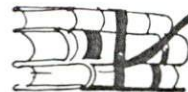
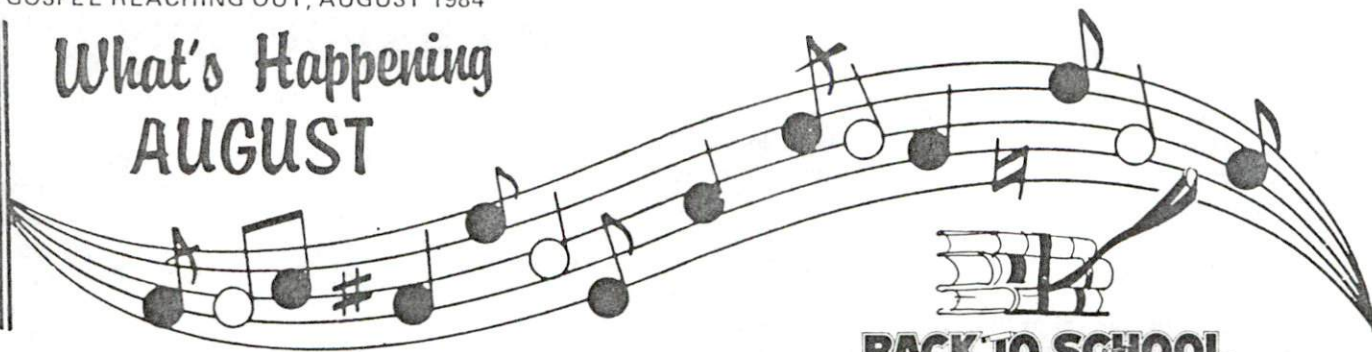

Recipes

EARLY HARVEST MEAT LOAF

1½ lbs. ground beef
¾ cup fine dry bread crumbs
¾ cup canned apple sauce
6 tbsps. catsup
¾ tsp. salt
¼ tsp. ground sage

How to prepare dish: mix ground beef lightly with remaining ingredients until well blended. Shape into a 6 inch square in a shallow pan. Bake in moderate oven at 350 F for 50 min. Cut into oblongs; remove with spatula or pancake turner. Garnish each with a spiced apple ring if you wish. 6 servings.

GOURMET CHICKEN BREAST

5 whole chicken breast (halved and boned)
2 cups commercial sour cream
1½ tbsps. Worcestershire sauce
¼ tsp. garlic powder (scant)
2 tsp. salt
1 tbsps. dry sherry
¼ tsp. paprika
Fine dry bread crumbs
1 tbsps. parsley flakes

Place boned chicken breast in a non-metal box or baking dish in a single layer. Mix together, sour cream, Worcestershire sauce, garlic powder, salt, sherry and paprika. Pour over chicken, coating each piece thoroughly. Add remainder of breast and the mixture. Cover and refrigerate over night. To bake: First dip each piece of chicken in bread crumbs coating well, and place in a shallow, lightly greased baking dish. Bake uncovered in a pre-heated 325° oven for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Carefully remove to serving platter. Serves 10.

PISTACHIO PINEAPPLE SALAD

1 large can chunk pineapple, juice and all
1 small pkg. instant pistachio pudding
2 cups miniature marshmallows
1 cup chopped nuts
1 large container cool whip
