Report of recommendations and suggestions of the Executive Committee of the Board of Regents at their meeting on June 18, 1925.

Owing to the rush of the opening of the Summer School and the overwhelming work connected with the organization, the meeting of the Executive Committee which was set for June 11th was postponed till June 18th, at which time the meeting was held in the office of President Cherry.

The first item discussed was the increasing and exorbitant cost for electric current on the Hill. Attention was called to the fact that a different rate for motors should be made. In connection with this, President Cherry was requested to learn from President Coates of the Eastern Teachers College the cost of erecting, equipping, and operating their power plant. As the contractor for the new Training School building was present, he was asked to give his opinion as to the expense of erecting a plant that would be large enough to take care of the need of the institution. He thought possibly fifteen thousand dollars might answer the purpose.

A letter from Mr. Brown, the Architect, in which he requested approval of certain changes in plans and specifications of the Training School was read, and proposed changes approved. The letter follows:

My dear Mr. Cuthbertson:

I am in receipt of several propositions in reference to slight changes and extras from the the Raymond Contracting Company,

as per enclosed copies of original propositions, designating what they cover and the price.

The first one refers to installing two drips in the 4" and 7" risers in the building, at a copy of \$53.60.

The second, is in reference to dividing the radiator at the end of the corridor on first floor into two, making an additional cost of \$44.00.

The third in reference to furnishing an additional radiator in basement, at a cost of \$150.00.

The two first extras are necessary in order to secure as nearly perfect an installation as possible, and the last one is caused by the changes made in the basement several times when the heating system had to be revised to take care of a system which was originally intended for some other purpose than class rooms.

Hoping you will take this up with your committee and let me have your instructions as to whether or not you wish to approve these items as extras, so that the orders can be issued to the contractor at the earliest possible moment one way or the other, I beg to remain,

Mr. Cuthbertson and Judge Denhardt were requested to see the City Board about a booster pump and stand which are needed in getting water to the upper levels of the New Training School building, since no water tower of the proper capacity and height seems likely to be built because of its almost prohibitive cost.

Minutes of the Board of Regents for Meeting of July 2, 1925.

At a called meeting of the Board of Regents, July 2, 1925, there were present in the office of President Cherry, State Superintendent of Education, Dr. McHenry Rhoads, Mrs. James, Mr. Cuthbertson, and Judge Denhardt, Regents, with President Cherry.

The Local Committee (consisting of Judge Denhardt and Mr. Cuthbertson), was asked to continue efforts in the matter of solving the difficulties connected with the water supply on the Hill.

Upon motion of Regent Cuthbertson with a second from Mrs. James, the following resolution was unanimously adopted by roll call:

"The Board of Regents in session assembled, there being present State Superintendent Rhoads, General Denhardt, Mrs. James, and Mr. Cuthbertson, and it appearing that the Western Kentucky State Normal School and Teachers College will be in need of moneys for the current expenses until taxes for the current Fiscal year ending June 30, 1926, are collected and paid, the Treasurer is hereby authorized and instructed to borrow from time to time such funds as may be needed for current expenses and as needed not in excess in the aggregate of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00), and he is further instructed to issue the notes of the institution for the sums so borrowed, bearing interest not in excess of six per cent (6%), said notes being due from time to time and to be paid in full out of moneys due this institution from the State of Kentucky during the current fiscal year ending June 30, 1926.

A motion was made by Judge Denhardt that the Chairman be authorized to appoint a committee of one or two to appear with him before the Sinking Fund Commission for the purpose of urging the ratification of the proposed sale
