



SPARKLING CHRISTMAS PUNCH

- 2 10-ounce package frozen sweetened strawberries
- 1 6-cunce can fromen lemonade concentrate
- 1 4/5-quart bottle rose! wine, chilled
- 2 28-ounce bottles ginger ale, chilled
- 1 28-ounce bottle club soda, chilled
- 2 trays ice cubes
- cup sugar orange slices for garnish

It shall be limited to women who are gainfully employed in business at the time they accept membership and sho are of good moral character. Lembership shall include women owning or operating their own businesses, women in professions, women in the amploy of any state or federal government or unit thereof including a municipality or county, or other public corporation, women employed by educational institutions, whether public or private, and women employed by charitable or religious institutions.

1 package (3 oz.) Jell-O, Lemon Flavor

1 cup boiling water

a cup cold water

teaspoon rum extract (optional)

3/4 cup canned eggnog

can (8 oz.) pear halves *
1 package (3 oz.) Jell-O, Cherry or Raspberry

- 1. Dissolve lemon flavor gelatin in 1 cup boiling water. Add 4 cup cold water and extract. heasure 3/4 cup gelatin, add eggnog. too beansle said ei teut
- 2. Pour into a 6-cup ring mold. Chill until set but not firm, about 25 minutes. Drain fruits, measuring syrup. Add water to syrup to make 3/4 oup. Dice the pears,
- 3. Dissolve cherry golatin in 1 cup boiling waters add measured liquid and the remaining lemon gelating Chill until thickened. Add pears and spoon into mold over eggnog-gelatin mixture.
- 4. Arrange oranges in gelatin near edge of mold, pressing down lightly. Chill until firm, about 4 hours, & Unmold. Garnish with maraschino cherries, if desired. For an attractive addition fill center with 12 cups pecans. Nakes 52 cups or 10 servings.

*Or use 1 cup seeded halved green grapes. **To unmold, dip mold just to the rim in warm water. Lossen gelatin at edge of mold with fingertips. Shake gently, place moistened plate over mold and invert. Lift off mold.
