Good morning, Mary. . .

. . .I wanted to respond to your question before the January meeting, and give the Executive Board time to discuss the matter.

Mary, there is no specific prohibition against awarding scholarships to members or members' relatives. However, it is strongly recommended that this not be done. Article XIV, Section 1 of the Standard Chapter Bylaws states that "The chapter is organized not for profit, and no part of the net earnings will inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual. . ." It is possible that, were the I.R.S. to investigate the chapter's records and find that scholarships are being awarded to members, that the chapter could lose its tax exempt status.

Another reason that we do not recommend this is that we have heard from chapters who have found that feelings can be hurt when the chapter is forced to choose between two candidates. It is possible, in future years, that the chapter would have several members or member's relatives applying for scholarships. If the chapter is only able to support one or two of these candidates, this can cause problems.

We recommend to chapters that they submit the names of members to other chapters in their area. In this way, there can be no question of "favorites" or preferential treatment. Another option would be to submit the candidate's name for an SBMEF loan or grant. In either of these situations, the member would be considered as any other applicant.

I do hope, Mary, that the chapter will give very serious consideration to establishing the precedent of awarding scholarships to members or members' relatives. I might add that a number of chapters have adopted Standing Rules prohibiting this practice for the reasons that I have outlined above.

RHONDA WALKER

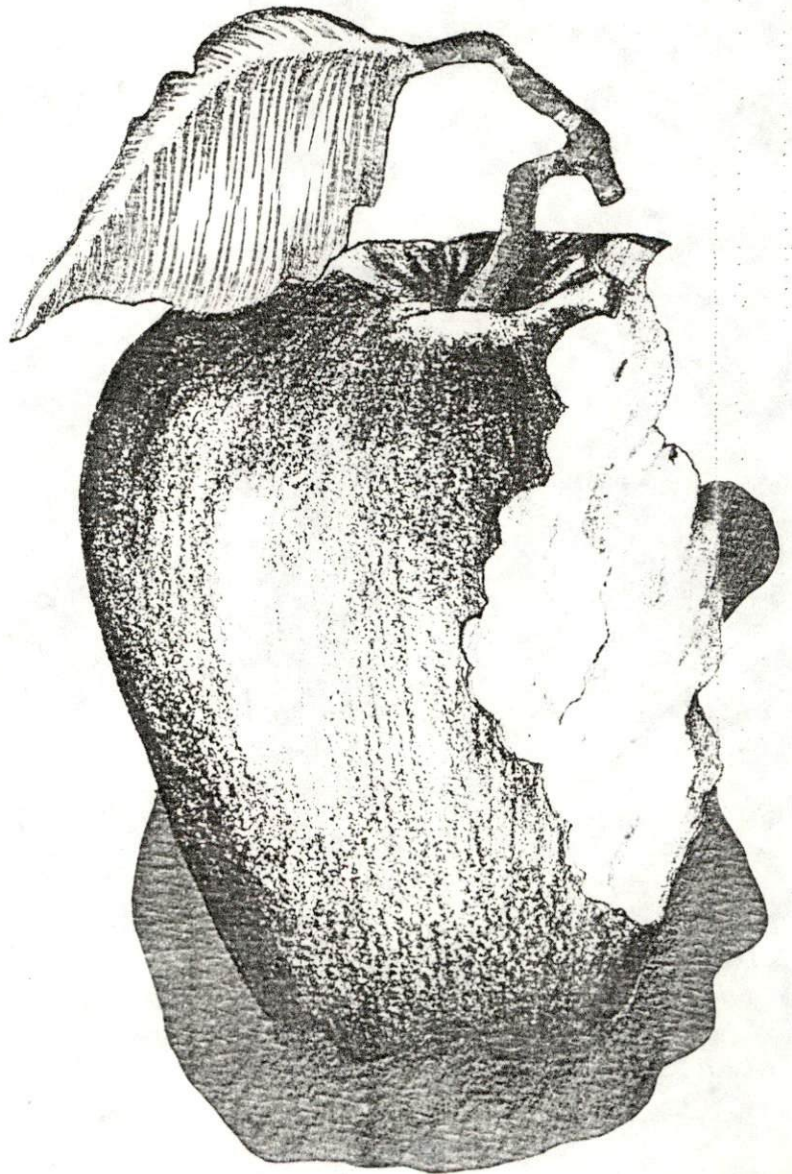

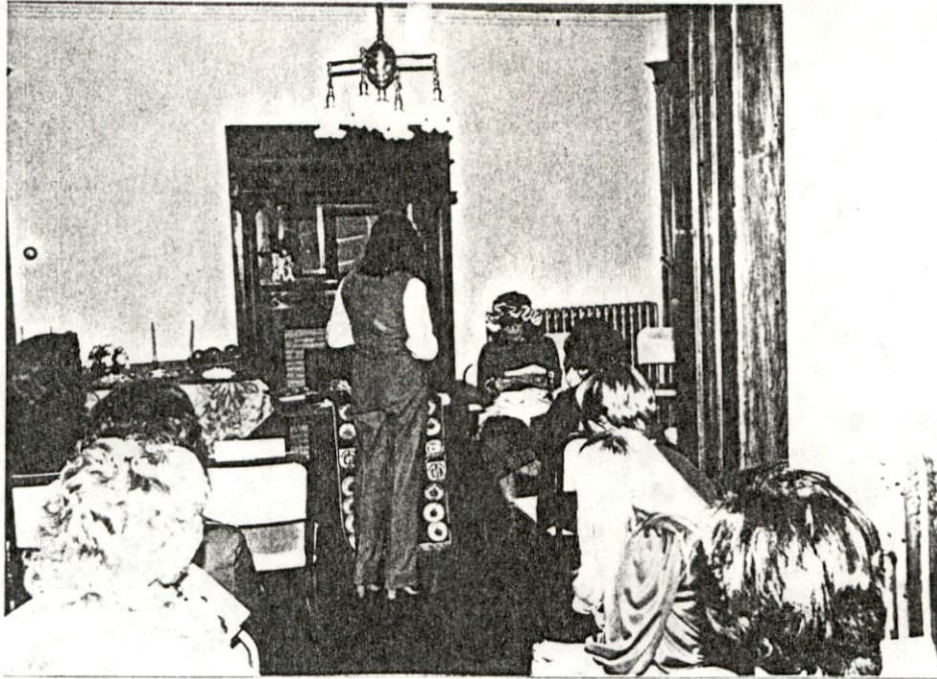

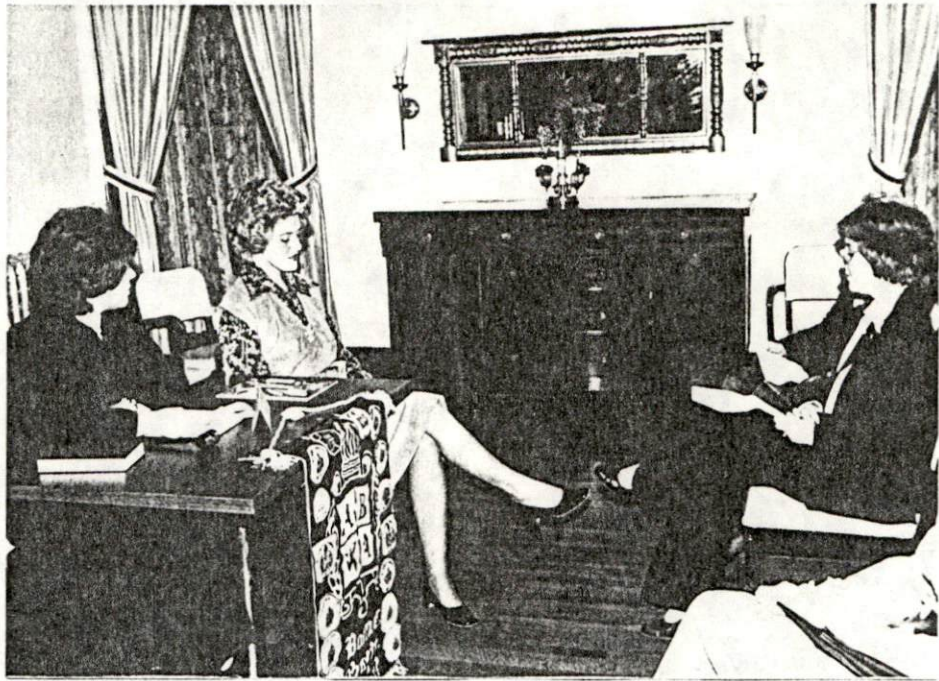
