Continued from volume 37, Issue 3. All sent to Lakeland.

- Page 30: REDFORD, Clyde., 1 January 1913. Age 37. Condition began several months ago, growing worse. Has been arrested and placed in the custody of the jailer of Barren Co.
- Page 32: EVERETT, Matt, 5 February 1913. Age 48. Condition has existed two weeks and is growing worse. Has been restrained by his family.
- Page 34: JOLLY, Mary, 10 February 1913. Age 39. Condition has existed several days. Married, husband is a farm hand.
- Page 36: STOUT, Bob, 30 April 1913. Age 43. Condition has existed about 3 weeks. Carpenter, owns house and lot in Glasgow worth \$1900 and not enough estate to support him in asylum.
- Page 38: BRIDGES, Don, 5 August 1913. Age 28. Condition has existed 2-3 weeks. Aunt has been in asylum.
- Page 40: SMILEY, George (Black), 22 September 1913. Age 32. Condition existed about one week; imagines he is pursued by a mob; is violent; has been arrested and confined in jail.
- Page 42: BISHOP, John J, 7 Oct 1913. Age 62. Condition has existed six months or more. He has had 2-3 attacks. Was adjudged insane and sent to the asylum 6 December 1892.
- Page 44: GARNETT, Earl (yellow), 22 October 1913. Age 14. Condition has existed about one month. Parents alive.
- Page 46: REYNOLDS, Lillie, 4 December 1913. Age 42. Religious mania, growing worse. Claims to have miraculous power. Father dead; mother alive; husband in real estate. Has had medical care at home with a nurse.
- Page 48: BAILEY, Elisa, 14 February 1914. Age 38. Condition has existed since last

- November. Parents dead; husband has a tract of land and a quantity of personal property but has dependent on him a family of seven children.
- Page 50: BOWLES, John J., 14 March 1914. Age 35. Parents alive; married. Has a small quantity of personal property worth \$100.
- Page 52: GREER, Mary, 1 June 1914. Age 23. Condition has existed about 4 months; subject to fits and has grown worse. Father alive; widow; has no estate.
- Page 54: SIMMONS, H. C., Mrs., 14 August 1914, age 49. Condition has existed for a number of years. No restraint, except to guard her at home. Parents dead; married. Family depends on husband for support consisting of three children.
- Page 56: WHITE, Ethel, 31 August 194. Age 22. Condition has existed about 3 months. Violent; married; has been kept by husband. Husband owns property worth \$1500, has a family of three male children.
- Page 58: JORDAN, Lettie Jane, 12 Oct 1914. Age 18. Condition has existed one year. Born Allen County KY; single. Has been watched at home.
- Page 60: CARVER, Willie, 20 October 1914. Age 74 or 24 (unreadable). Condition has existed about one month; violent; his relatives watching him. Married; religious mania; father unknown; mother dead.
- Page 62: SETTLES, Luther, 22 October 1914. Age 60. Condition has existed about 2 months, inclined to be despondent. Single, brother is insane. Has been kept by brother and watched at home.
- Page 64: NORVELL, Sam, 25 January 1915. Age 53. Affidavit of S. J. Smoch and J. S. Leech stating that he is of unsound mind and violent. Parents dead.
- Page 66: BRIDGES, Queen Dellie, 24 March 1915. Age 32. Condition has existed for more than a year; violent; has been kept at home by family. Parents alive, has four children. A half aunt was insane.
- Page 68: BARLOW, Lucian, 12 April 1915. Age 75. Condition has existed about 3 months. Owns about \$75. personal property. Was in Lakeland December 1909.
- Page 70: YOUNG, Hardin D., 31 May 1915. Age about 33. Condition has existed for several months, has grown worse. At times violent and has been and is now restrained by relatives and friends. Father alive, farmer, single.
- Page 72: GARNETT, Earl, 17 June 1915. Age 16. Condition has existed eight days, Black. Has been before adjudged a lunatic, violent.
- Page 74: LOCKHART, Mary, 14 Sept 1915. Age 37. Condition has existed about 3

years. Violent, has been restrained by family. Mother is alive. Has interest in a tract of land.

Page 76: HARLAN, Lou V., October 1915. Age 64. Born Metcalfe Co. KY; married; parents dead. She has been kept at home.

Page 78: CRENSHAW, Walter, 11 October 1915. Age 23. Black. Condition has existed about three months. Born Metcalfe Co KY. Parents alive and reside in Hart Co. KY. Has been placed in jail because it was unsafe for him to be at home.

Page 80: BOSTON, Annie, Mrs., 1 November 1915. Age 42. Condition has existed about six weeks. Born Hart Co KY. Mother is alive and lives in Hart Co. Married; husband is a salesman. Violent.

**EARLY HOMES OF GLASGOW AND BARREN COUNTY**

Continued from Volume 37, Issue 3.

The house on Brown Street, now the T. P. Dickinson home, as it was of his father also, M. H. Dickinson, was built by Rev. S. P. Forgy, a Baptist minister who was here about 1850. Two very prominent Presbyterian Ministers of the early times were Rev. John Howe, whose home was not in town but on Boyd's Creek. His wife was a sister of the wife of Joseph Ralston, the pioneer, and Rev. Hervev Woods, who was a teacher also. His home was in the Fowler house at the corner of Water Street and Broadway. Mr. Woods was the grandfather of the late J. M. Richards. The home of Roy Watkins, on Maple Driveway was built by John Lewis, Sr. for his son, Joseph H. Lewis who lived there in 1860. It then became the home of Judge S. H. Boles, and then of the late George T. Duff.

Charles Anderson built a home in South Glasgow. The unique character of this house was that it had a "fish pond" on the roof.

About 1870 Noah Smith, afterwards Judge Smith, built the house on North Race Street, now the home of Thomas Dickinson.

The home of "Aunt Becky Saunders", widow for 40 years of Michael Smith Sunders, was lately razed to make room to the modern Dutch Colonial home of Dr. J. W. Acton on Maple Driveway.

Of the homes in the county outside of Glasgow, each was called, and really was, "A Settlement," with its barns, granaries, shops and the Negro quarters. On Beaver Creek north of town, now the property of Dolph Depp, was the home of John Hall. It is said, his was one of only four families in the county in the beginning of 1798. He was an extensive land owner, had a military grant, more than a thousand acres of land. When the sands of time oftime was running low for him, he called his children around his bed and told them he had made no will, but wanted them to divide his earthly possessions, amicably, among

themselves. This was carried out to the letter as one can see recorded in our County Court Clerk's office, the lengthy paper of this division signed by each of his children.

Between Beckton and Game (Old Rocky Hill) on Beaver Creek, we find a modest inclosure with some ten or more graves of the departed of a family. On one stone we read "William Edmunds, born Amherst County, Virginia, Oct. 16, 1776 Died Jan. 21, 1863, and nearby his wife, who was Mary Penn of Virginia; then lifting our eyes we see scarcely a stone's throw away, a two room house of hewn logs, where this man came, made his home, and reared his children, afterwards building the brick house, lately razed which stood between the log house and the burying grounds. This home – the two so close together – brings forcibly to mind the lines from Will Carlton's poem: "Out of the old house Nancy, moved up into the new, All the hurry and worry is just as good as through, Only a bounden duty remains for you and I, And that's to stand on the doorstep here, and bid the old house good-bye."

On the Lower, or Old Bowling Green road, then called the Mayfield Road, across Beaver Creek with its covered bridge, there is a house known a generation ago as the "Winlock Place." This was the home of the Mayfields. John Mayfield was a very early citizen of this county, and figured very largely in county affairs. On the opposite side of the creek was the Bishop old home. On the same road, two miles from town, Rubin Huggins settled. He came here after the War of 1812 in which he served, built his home of logs, afterwards weatherboarded. This was later the home of the Beck family. Sidney Beck lived here until 1869, when it was bought and remodeled and became the home of W. E. Huggins.

Joseph Warder Sr. came from Virginia to this county about 1811. He settled east of Glasgow on what was known as "The Sinks of Beaver Creek" near Dripping Springs Meeting House where his large family grew to maturity. Three of his sons – Walter, John and William – became Baptist preachers of renown; a son-in-law, Zacheus Quessenberry was a Methodist preacher. His other sons, Joseph and Henry, and his sons-in-law, Alexander Evans and Clement Hitch, made their home near him.

The Bryan home in the Pisgah neighborhood, where Albert Bryan lived and reared his family, is said to have been built, or a portion of it the Joseph Warder, Sr., or his son, John Warder, whose home it was at one time. [so written].

Still farther out near Hiseville ("Goose Horn" in those far off days) is a brick house built in 1817, by Bartlett Graves, whose home it was. The house is now standing. The name of Mr. Graves is found frequently on the pages of the early history of this county. In the orchard east of this old home he with his wife and several children are buried.

In this direction, east and north east of Glasgow lived Thornton Settle, Thomas Eubank, Edmund Duff, Is(h)am Hardy, Henry Winlock, Cader Edwards, Alexander Edwards, William Wood and many others.

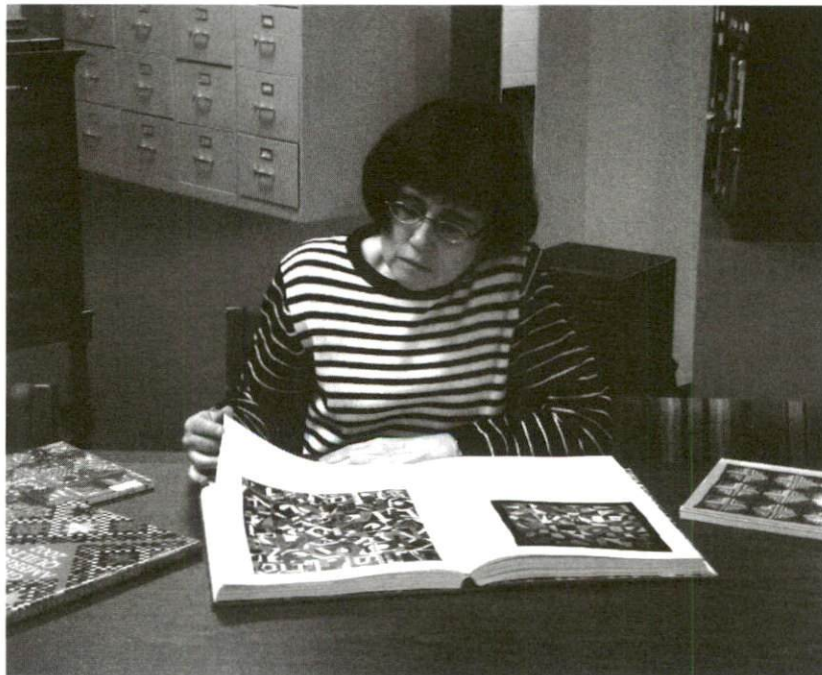
In the Cave City country was Edward Prewitt, supposed to have given his name to "Prewitts Knob," Elisha Dickey, father of Thomas, Benjamin F. (who married Mary, daughter of Daniel Curd, the pioneer), and Dr. Joseph. Mr. Dickey's home was near the foot of Prewitt's Knob; William King, Peter King, Woodford Martin, Claborn Harlow, Michael

Harlow, John Burks, George Jameson, Robert Jameson, George Duke, William Duke, William Wells, Pascal Kirtley, Nathaniel G. Terry, Isaac Smith, Shelton Farris, John Farris, Jessie Smith, Price Curd, son of Daniel, Hardin Y. Davis, a grandson of Hardin Davis, the pioneer, all were familiar names in this section.

On the Columbia Road, near Dugantown, there stood for many years now entirely gone, a brick house that was the home of William Logan, while Clerk of the Court, a period of thirty or more years, beginning about 1800. He was the grandfather of Hon. W. L. Porter, whose address before the Kentucky Bar Association in Frankfort, in April 1929, "Sixty Years at the Bar in Kentucky" is worthy of a place in the history of our state. The house built in 1815, by Captain William Day, is still standing. He with his wife Sophia Strange Day, are buried nearby. This is east of town on Boyds Creek. On this creek were the homes of the Mansfields, Tolles, John & Carl Snoddy, John O. Morrison, who is said to have had a deer park on his plantation. The Hammer family and Peden family also lived in this section. In the section between Glasgow Junction and Cave City were the Proctor, Sanderson, Mustain, Wilson, Parrish, Shipley and Caldwell families. Two brothers came from North Carolina, Michael Smith and Isaac Smith, and settled on Peters Creek and Skeggs Creek, respectively, ten or more miles from the county seat. In the same general section were the families of John Higdon, Martin, Wilborn, Wade, Daugherty, Wright, Gentry, Childers, Norville, Denham, Wooten, Ferguson, Duncan, Branstetter, Scott, Chism, Holloway, Joshua Wilson, Nunnally, Hamilton and Ritter families.

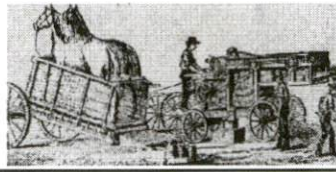

**TRAVELING WHEAT THRASHERS**

By Phyllis Houchens, Glasgow as told by Goebel Houchens, Glasgow, 1984.

The 1920s were difficult times for many rural families in or near Lamb and the surrounding communities. Many families were tenants. They worked the farms, raising corn, tobacco, and wheat for the owner. Goebel Houchens was one of the many who earned their lives working as a tenant. In the mid-summer he and a man named Luther Allen would travel through nearby communities thrashing wheat for families.

They would use a wheat thrasher and a steam engine owned by Jim Walbert, their landlord. The wheat thrasher was powered by a steam engine. The steam engine was something like the tractor, except it was fired by wood and contained a huge barrel for water that produced the steam. The wheat thrasher had a large cylinder in the middle of it. Goebel Houchens put the cut wheat into this cylinder which contained teeth that fed the wheat. The ends of the wheat were then chopped off and sent through a blower then down a

pipe into sacks. The remainder of the wheat would feed through the back of the thrasher and empty out into large straw stacks.

Goebel and Luther would sometimes be separated from their families for weeks. They usually stayed with the family they worked for that week. Goebel remembers one event that happened with one family. He said everyone had eaten supper and had gone to bed. He was almost asleep when he felt something crawling on him and biting his legs. He said he got out of bed and lit the oil lamp. He was going to find out what had bitten him.

When he turned on the lamp, bedbugs were crawling all over his bed. He said he took the blanket off his bed and shook it out. He put the blanket on the floor and slept the remainder of the night on the floor! Sometimes families wouldn't have room in their houses for Goebel and Luther to sleep, so they would sleep under the wheat thrasher. They would pile up some straw and put a tarpaulin on it and sleep. They used stacks of straw for pillows.

These are just a few of the stories Mr. Houchens recalls. He is now eighty-four years old and talks enjoyably of his life in earlier years. He says it is much easier for him to recall events that happened sixty or seventy years ago than it is to remember the things that happened last week.

**ENDURANCE AT COMER DENTON'S POULTRY HOUSE**

As a young man, Comer Denton had made more than one trip to Detroit to find work. Each time he had returned home, dissatisfied with life in the big city. He had married, but both he and his wife found city living unsuitable to them. In the small town of Park City, Kentucky, an old white, weather-worn structure stood empty on the corner of First Street and Grand Avenue. In the past, the building had been used as a store for general merchandise, a pool room, and a restaurant, but in 1926 Comer took over the building and opened the Comer Denton Poultry House.

At first, people from the surrounding area brought their chickens, cow and horse hides, and eggs to the poultry house. Comer paid ten to twelve cents a pound for hens, five to ten dollars for hides, and twenty cents a dozen for eggs. Prices varied through the years; for example, Comer paid five cents a dozen for eggs in 1930.

One day, a farmer brought in a load of turkeys to be dressed. The turkeys had been running with the farmer's old flea-bitten hound dogs. It wasn't long before Comer's wife, who often helped in the business, told Comer she had found a flea on her leg. Then two fleas were on Comer. Comer said, "It took three or four months to get rid of all those fleas!"

Comer Denton's Poultry House continued:

In 1932, as more people entered the poultry business, it was necessary to send trucks out to pick up the products from the farmers. Soon Comer had two trucks going out every day. Business boomed. The work day started at five in the morning and often continued until ten and eleven at night. The hours were long, but Comer found the work very satisfying, as he was making a living in the small town he was so fond of.

Among his best customers were the Mammoth Cave Hotel and the dining cars on the railroad that ran directly in front of the poultry house. Comer supplied them with dressed chickens and turkeys. He delivered to the hotel, and the train stopped to pick up for the dining cars. On its run to and from Florida, the once-famous Pan Am passenger train made stops at Park City to pick up fresh poultry. Passenger trains going through Park City are now a part of the past.

Today, all of the poultry houses are closed in the small towns around Park City. Even though Comer is eighty-one years old, he opens up that old building six days a week to sell eggs and chickens, which he purchases from large companies. Business does not flourish as it once did, but the Comer Denton Poultry House has endured.
