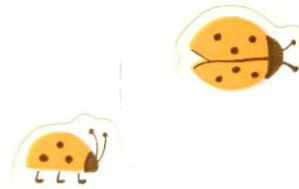

Bruner also requested in a letter to President Reagan, that he issue a Presidential Proclamation for September 22 to be a national "American Business Women's Day", citing the "enormous efforts of today's dynamic, concerned business women", as shown in the \$1,600,000 scholarships given to women in the past year as reason for our own special day.
