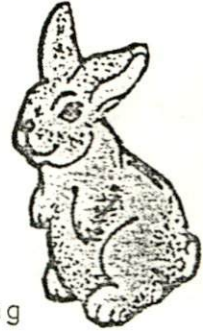

Wrote the scholarship checks for the two recipients.


Ordered flowers for new member Diane Hunton.

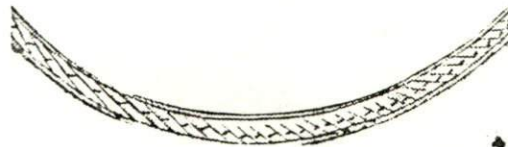
