Lieut. James Henry Ferguson, known as "Jiggs" to his friends on the Hill, was killed in action in Germany, November 26. The son of Mr. and Mrs. George Ferguson, Lieut. Ferguson came to Western from Logan county and was graduated with the class of '43. While here he was active in R. O. T. C. work. 1-12-45

Funeral services for Lieut. James Henry Ferguson, BS '43, first of Simpson county's war dead to be returned for burial, was held November 10. CHH 12-5-47
Military services at the Sulphur Springs cemetery were directed by the Franklin American Legion post and the Russellville post of Veterans of Foreign Wars. The V. F. W. furnished a color guard and an eight-man firing squad.
Lieutenant Ferguson was killed in action in the Hurtgen forest in Belgium November 26, 1944, while serving with the 4th Infantry Division. He had entered service in April, 1943, following graduation from Western. He trained from September until December of 1943 with the ASTP unit at Western.
The Simpson countian was commissioned a second lieutenant at Fort Benning, Georgia, in May of 1944 and was sent overseas the following September.



Additional trophies have been placed on exhibition at the Kentucky Building. These new curios from the British Solomon Islands which were sent by Lt. Belmont Forsythe, U. S. Marines, include three war clubs, decorated for use in native ceremonies; grass skirts, made from palm stems; wooden combs, worn as ornaments in native dress; and a number of sea shells.

Lieut. Forsythe, AB '40, is now in the hospital at Memphis.

From private to second lieutenant in the marine corps in seven and a half months is the record of Belmont Forsythe, Belton, Muhlenberg County, former principal of the Scottsville, Ky., public schools. A graduate of Western State Teachers College, Bowling Green, Lieutenant Forsythe enlisted in the marines December 8 as a private. His rise was rapid. Veteran Pilot Now Commands Squad

Capt. Justis D. Foster, of Junction City, was recently appointed commanding officer of a fighter squadron at the 8th AAF Composite Command Station.

Capt. Foster, a veteran fighter pilot with more than 84 missions over enemy territory, has destroyed two enemy aircraft in combat. He holds the Distinguished Flying Cross with one Oak Leaf Cluster and the Air Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters.

He entered the Service in November, 1941, as an aviation cadet at Fort Thomas. In July, 1942, he was commissioned a 2nd lieutenant on completion of flight training at Kelly Field, Texas. He arrived overseas in January, 1943.

Before assuming his new duties at this station, Capt. Foster was a flying instructor for P-47 Thunderbolt fighter pilots.

The captain attended the Cornishville high school, Cornishville, and Western. He was employed by the Seagram Distilleries, Louisville.

Throughout this period he established a reputation for getting his trucks through to their destination despite adverse weather conditions caused by mud, snow, and blackout driving, rendering invaluable assistance to the regimental combat teams." Lieutenant Fox is now serving in Germany with the 9th Army.
