Frederick Nahm, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Nahm of this city, has been promoted from second lieutenant to the rank of first lieutenant. Lieutenant Nahm, who is with the engineering corps, is stationed at Camp Campbell.

Lieutenant Colonel John G. Napier, 28, A-26 Invader medium bomber pilot from Scottsville and a former Western student, recently completed a tour of duty on the Western Front in an attack on the rallyards at Hammeln, Germany, 24 miles southwest of Hannover. The attack was designed to delay the reported movement of German troops from Holland to central Germany, where they were to be used as reinforcements against the U. S. First Army. 5-25-45
Colonel Napier, who holds the Air Medal with ten Oak Leaf Clusters, was one of the original pilots of the Ninth Air Force's "Famous 416th" Bombardment Group.

A NINTH AIR FORCE BOMBER BASE (Spl.)—Major John G. Napier, 27, husband of Mrs. Juanita S. Napier of Scottsville, is one of the newest squadron commanders in this A-20 Havoc Light Bombardment unit, but he is, by contrast, entirely familiar with the armored and infantry forces his bombers are supporting in France. Five days after the Japanese struck at Pearl Harbor, Major Napier was graduated from Kelly Field, Texas, as a second lieutenant in the Army Air Forces. With two pilots who are also commanding squadrons in this group, Majors Robert F. Price of Valley Chapel, W. Va., and David L. Willets of Morgantown, W. Va., Major Napier was dispatched on maneuvers to Blythe, Cal., where he served under the command of Lieutenant General George S. Patton Jr., now U. S. Armored Forces commander in France. At present, the training with Patton which Major Napier put in a few years ago, is paying large dividends. He has completed 28 operational missions over enemy territory since arriving in the European theatre of operations with the first American force of Ninth Air Force A-20s. The West Virginia got off to a slow start while serving as assistant group operations officer. His work in this capacity required his attention on the ground, and it was not until he was assigned as squadron commander that Major Napier was enabled to fly as consistently as he desired. Serving now as box leader, Major Napier and his bombardier-navigator, Second Lieutenant James Madenfort of Pottsville, Pa., re-

cently led a small force of Havocs in an attack on a series of railroad bridges just ahead of Allied troops in France. A graduate of Scottsville High school, and a former student of Western Kentucky Teachers College of Bowling Green, Major Napier has served in various capacities during his army career. As a squadron engineering officer at Blythe, he earned the admiration of veteran members of this group, especially crew chiefs and mechanics. During the maneuvers held in the California desert, where Lieutenant General Patton expressed a desire to have live bombs dropped on his armored troops in order to simulate actual battle conditions, Napier's engineering crews were among the most proficient in the unit. His organization, Major Napier has been one of the original members of the Havoc Group commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Theodore R. Aylesworth of Knoxville, Pa. Napier's father, J. B. Napier, also resides in Scottsville.

The classification center is the first stop in a training program that will eventually graduate Cadet Neel as a second lieutenant, with wings, in the Army Air Forces. COL. NEWMAN HEADS PROVINCIAL AMG

Col. James R. Newman, AB '26, director of American Military Government in the German province of Greater Hesse, has been highly commended for his reorganization services in this province, according to an announcement received by the dean's office. *2-15-46*

The letter of commendation, received from higher military circles in the area of Greater Hesse, accompanied a report of the activities of the American Military Government there. Various phases of reconstruction include the following: education, religion, food and agriculture, public health, public works and utilities, industry, economics, transportation, and forestry. This report was released at a joint American-German press conference, December 21, 1945.

Colonel Newman, social science major here, later received the Master of Arts and the Doctor of Philosophy degrees at Columbia university, New York City. A reserve officer in the United States Coast Artillery prior to Pearl Harbor, he was, for several years preceding that time, supervising principal of schools at Floral Park, New York.

Col. James R. Newman, AB '26 is serving as head of the military government for Greater Hessen, Germany, the second largest region in the American occupied zone, with headquarters at Wiesbaden. He has just finished setting up the third regional government for the country. As commanding officer, it is his duty to appoint for each region a minister president to head the civil government, and he has final jurisdiction over all military government detachments in the region. The minister president appointed by Colonel Newman on October 1 heads a civil government for some three and one-half million German people. *11-23-45*

Colonel Newman is a cousin of Dr. C. Grise, Dean of the college.

Former Student Is On Bing Crosby's Radio Program

Lieutenant Colonel James R. Newman, former Western student, was among those participating in the Bing Crosby radio program Thursday night, January 14.

Lieutenant Colonel Newman graduated from Western in 1927. He received his M.A. and his Ph.D. from Columbia University in New York City. For a number of years before the entrance of America into World War II he was the supervising principal of Floral Park New York schools. He entered the service in the summer of 1941 as a captain in the Coast Artillery and was made secretary of the Balloon Barrage School now located at Camp Tyson, Tenn. For some months he has been on active duty with a balloon barrage battalion in California.

Newman Warns Germans To Curb Disturbances

5-30-47

Another Western graduate figured prominently in world news last week.

Dr. James R. Newman, AB '26, now military governor in Land Greater Hesse, one of the three American occupied zones in Germany, warned the German people that the death penalty would be invoked if necessary to curb disturbances arising out of protests over the shortage of food.

Dr. Newman is a first cousin of Dr. F. C. Grise, dean of Western. In a letter from Richard F. Grise, who graduated from Western in 1941, telling of a recent visit to Dr. New-

man he states, "J. R. Newman is an amazing person, and has made quite a name for himself over here. He is now the governor of the Land Greater Hesse which includes over four million people—he has received the French Medal of Honor—he has a legal advisory staff of 37 and under him are working 80 men whose individual salaries are \$10,00 a year—the respect and admiration that the people who work with him have for him seems to bear out the fact that he is doing a good job."

Lt. Richard F. Grise, M.C., is chief surgeon at the station hospital on Tereira Island in the Azores. After graduating from Western he received the MD degree from Vanderbilt university in 1944 and did his internship at the University of Virginia hospital.

Lt. Grise recently flew to Germany from the Azores and while there visited Colonel Newman.

Lt. Grise is the son of Western's dean, Dr. F. C. Grise and Mrs. Grise.
