

Many thanks to Phyllis McKinney for allowing us to have our December dinner and meeting in her lovely new home! The menu was "Casseroles and Desserts" and we have some great cooks in our chapter. Below are some of the delicious recipes we sampled at Phyllis' house.

Fruit Salad - Diane Hunton

- 1 can fruit cocktail
- 1 can pineapple chunks or tidbits
- 1 pkg or box frozen strawberries (partly thawed)
- 2 boxes instant vanilla pudding
- 2 bananas, sliced

Drain canned fruit. Mix first 4 ingredients until dry pudding forms a gel. Add bananas and stir. Serve and enjoy!

Green Pea Casserole - Mimi Banton

1 pkg frozen peas diced pimentos, to taste ½ green pepper, chopped 1 small onion, chopped 2-3 hard boiled eggs

Mix all ingredients together with Miracle Whip.

Nacho Dip - Dianna Young

1 sm can Ro-tel, drained and mashed 1 lb browned sausage, drained 1 3 1b box Velveeta, melted

Mix together and serve with nacho chips.

Flaming Cherry Angel Cake - Mary Hines

8 oz cream cheese 8 oz cool whip pecans, chopped cherry pie filling lemon extract 9 sugar cubes

Angel Food Cake

Mix cream cheese and cool whip. Stir in pecans. Spread in bottom of large glass serving bowl. Pour cherry pie filling on top and spread out. Soak sugar cubes in lemon extract about 20 minutes. Put sugar cubes in center of filling and ignite with a kitchen match. Extinguish flame. Spoon out and serve over sliced angel food cake.
