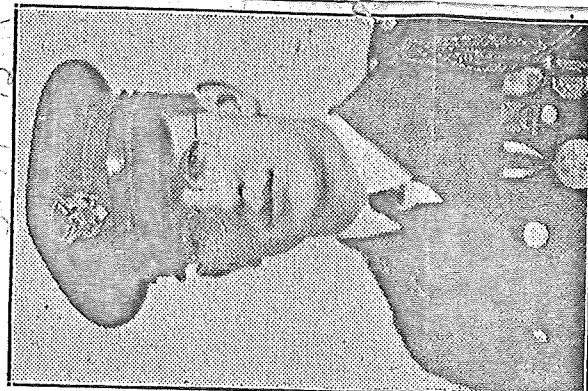

OREIGN SERVICE VOLUNTEER
—First Lieutenant Frank L. Yarbrough, son of Dr. and Mrs. H. M. He graduated at Western Teachers College in June, 1940. He was a member of the R. O. T. C. at the school for four years, and served as lieutenant colonel in the corps during his senior year. While at Western he received a medal for the outstanding second year basic student and good citizenship, awarded by the Sons of the American Revolution. He was elevated to the rank of first lieutenant last November.

Capt. Frank Yarbrough arrived in Bowling Green last Saturday, returning from troop escort duty in the Pacific. Eldest son of Dr. H. M. Former Student Serves Wounded In England

The 61st General Hospital, England—Lieutenant Zula M. Young, of Ft. No. 5, Bowling Green, night supervisor of this United States Army general hospital in England, finds no time to take naps during her swing-shift tours of inspection. There are dozens of wards which she must personally check. Before starting her tour of patients each evening Lt. Young goes over the hospital's record to determine which of the wounded have not made an improvement during the day. She then visits all of the seriously ill and consults with their ward nurses.

"I often find a medical officer coming to his ward during the night to visit one of his patients," said Nurse Young. "They're a conscientious lot."

Formerly a charge nurse in a station hospital in England before she was assigned to this hospital, her duty day was taken up with watching census reports; supervising patients' food; assigning nurses to their proper stations; making out duty rosters; checking each patient's name requiring the most attention; acting as custodian over the drug-alcohol-narcotics supply; and other problems vital to a large hospital operating efficiently.

A graduate of Western State Teachers College Training School, she attended the Western State College and also practiced as a private nurse before volunteering for the Army Nurse Corps. She entered the service in March, 1943.
