ACT NOW TO INVOLVE NEW MEMBERS

Have you ever worked hard to recruit new members, only to wind up a year later wondering why they didn't renew? If your chapter has new members, they're likely eager to forge friendships and contribute to projects. Their enthusiasm level may never be higher than it is right now!

Don't miss the chance to capture that energy through activation strategies that get them involved and keep them coming back.

Educate!

Empower your new members by educating them about your chapter.

Most chapters hold orientation sessions to bring new members up to speed. These typically include a brief presentation on the chapter's history, activities and benefits, and a question and answer period to address specific concerns.

Orientations can be held prior to the monthly chapter meeting, or a separate session can be held, especially if there is a large group of new members.

Integrate!

Encourage new and current members to drop business cards in a bowl, and draw names to get together for lunch between meetings.

Share "One Good Thing." - ask each member to share one good thingpersonal or professional that happened since it's last meeting.

Draw numbers or colors for seating. Members often sit at the same table month after month, which can alienate new members.

Activate!

When your new members are informed and comfortable in the chapter, you can begin to develop them into active chapter participants. By now, you should know their likes and dislikes, and can use this information to match them to the right committee or project. You may find your chapter has a longstanding project no new members are interested in. Perhaps you should examine whether the project still serves your chapter.

Appreciate!

Remember to recognize your newest members for their accomplishments. New members come to your chapter for the opportunity to grow, so make sure they get the chance. Satisfying new members can help your chapter grow. Activating new members activates your chapter!
