The National Board of Directors approved a \$3 increase in national annual dues for membership in the Association for members under the age 65, from \$27 to \$30. national annual dues will remain at \$27 for those over 65. The new rates will be reflected in membership statements for all members whose national anniversaries are January 1, or later.

According to national president Becky Early, the increase was implemented to help cover growing costs in three areas of endeavor: development of individual business skills, development of chapter leadership skills, and the Women in Business magazine.
