The university budget was discussed at some length. Budget requests from the colleges will be due in the Office of Academic Affairs on Thursday, February 20.


The deans were asked to remind members of their colleges the deadline for nominations for the Faculty Teaching and Research Awards is Monday, March 3.

Dr. Corts discussed the spring semester second bi-term course offerings.

Dr. Chelf requested that the deans ask their department heads to contact his office concerning proposed extended campus course offerings during the May Term and Summer Session. He also discussed several possible alternatives to both the present system of extended campus pay scales and the salaries for off-campus, TV, and/or evening classes. The deans discussed the costs and benefits of extended campus programs at some length.
