MINUTES

COUNCIL OF ACADEMIC DEANS.

August 26, 1975

The Council of Academic Deans met on Tuesday, August 26, 1975, at 1:30 p.m. in Room 120 of Diddle Arena. Present were Deans Cravens, Jenkins, Sutton, Mounce, Gray, Russell, Stroube, Sandefur, Chelf, Hourigan, Hardin, Corts, and Davis. President Downing and Dr. Cook were visitors at the meeting.

Dr. Sutton gave a progress report on registration. He stated that at this point in registration enrollment was higher than last Fall in every classification (freshman through graduate). Each college dean commented on the status of enrollment in his college.

Dr. Jenkins gave a report on the non-functioning cooling system in Grise Hall.

Dr. Cook requested the college deans to submit the proposed program report for the 1976-78 biennial budget to Dr. Cravens and Dr. Cook.

Drs. Davis and Corts discussed suggested topics to be included in a proposed Administrative Calendar. A tentative calendar will be submitted to the deans at a future meeting.

Dr. Cravens commented on the development of an Academic Program File in the Office of Academic Affairs. The purpose of the file is to provide each college dean and the Vice President for Academic Affairs with a complete, authentic and systematic record of approved academic programs.

Drs. Corts and Davis discussed a survey of faculty interest in topics for study through the Faculty/Staff Development Program. The survey will be distributed to the faculty within the next few days.

Dr. Corts gave a progress report on Western's AID proposal. Several WKU representatives will meet with AID officials in Washington later this week.

The decision was made to continue Extended Campus Stipends at the same level as in 1974-75.

The meeting adjourned at 3:25 p.m.
