Annually firmly by these presents sealed with our seals  
& Dated this 24<sup>th</sup> of September 1804 The condition of  
the above Obligation is such that whereas there  
is a Marriage shortly intended to be solemnized  
between the above bound Stephen Claypool & Salley  
Whitten for which a Licence has issued now  
now if there be no lawful cause to obstruct  
the said Marriage then this Obligation to  
void else to remain in full force & Virtue

by these Presents, Sealed with our Seals, and dated this *29<sup>th</sup>* Day of *August* 1808

THE CONDITION is such, that if there should be, no legal cause to obstruct a Marriage  
shortly intended to be solemnized between the said *James above the age of 21 years*  
& *Elizabeth Swearingen daughter of Samuel Swearingen Esquire*  
Then this Obligation to be void, else remain in full Force and Virtue.
