MINUTES

COUNCIL OF ACADEMIC DEANS

January 26, 1976

The Council of Academic Deans met on January 26 at 11 a. m. in the Office of Academic Affairs. Present were Deans Cravens, Sandefur, Russell, Hourigan, Corts, Sutton, Jenkins, Gray, Hardin, Mounce, Chelf, and Davis.

The topic of the length of the time break between classes was again discussed by the deans with each dean commenting on the reactions that he had received from department heads and faculty members in his area of responsibility concerning the matter. A final decision on the time break will be made at the next deans' meeting.

The deans discussed the suggested affirmative action form which Dr. Davis had distributed at the prior meeting. Dr. Davis was asked to take the suggestions made and bring a revised form to the next meeting of the group.

The deans discussed the draft revision of the Faculty Evaluation Forms. Drs. Jenkins and Sandefur indicated that they would get additional information concerning evaluation work which had been done in their colleges to Dr. Davis so that these ideas might be incorporated in this year's evaluation form. A revised evaluation form will be discussed at the next meeting.


Dr. Cravens asked the deans to read the proposed program of Career Planning at Western which was attached to the agenda. This will be discussed at a future meeting.

Dr. Sandefur stated that the University is charging funded projects for telephone calls without prior notice to the individuals directing these projects. He also indicated that project printing is being charged commercial rates, a practice he thought to be unfair. The deans concurred in the concerns which Dr. Sandefur expressed.

Dr. Sandefur then commented on proposed regulations from the Kentucky Council of Teacher Education Certification. The deans went on record as supporting these regulations.

Many members of the group expressed significant concerns about the operation of the University mail room and the new "blue slip" policies. Dr. Cravens said that these concerns would be relayed to Mr. Largen and that Mr. Largen would be asked to attend a future meeting of the group.

The meeting adjourned at noon.
