KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We *James (J. Wade) & James Hines* are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Kentucky in the penal sum of 150, for the true payment whereof we bind ourselves, our heirs, &c. jointly and severly, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated this *19<sup>th</sup>* day of *November* 1826

THE CONDITION of this obligation is such that if there should be no legal cause to obstruct a marriage shortly intended to be solemnized between *S. Wade about 21 years of age & Nancy H. Hines ward of James Hines whose consent was given in person* for which a license is about issue, then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
