

THE MODEL ONE-TEACHER SCHOOL

May 17 1918

1. Should be in the country and made up of country pupils and country patrons.
2. Should have a plant and equipment within the reach of any live community, but certainly a good plant and attractive.
3. Should have a teacher, thoroughly competent and trained, but most of all a real rural teacher.
4. Should be near enough to the city to transport students for observation and practice without loss of time from other classes.
5. Initial cost:

a. For improving plant, not over-----	\$ 400.00
b. For increasing salary, not over-----	350.00
c. For auto to carry students-----	600.00
d. For equipment-----	100.00
e. For incidentals-----	50.00
Total, not to exceed-----	\$1500.00
