## APPENDIX B

This is the final graduate enrollment report for the Spring 2018 term. The final enrollment was 2576 (compared to Spring 2017, enrollment is -73).

Some things to note in this report:

- The change in foreign student enrollment (-109) is greater than the overall deficit
- The residency classification of “Military” continues to increase (202 in 2018; +63 vs. 2017)
- A decrease in the number of students with primary enrollment in a master’s programs (-81)

*Note: this report uses unduplicated headcount, which counts each student only in their primary program/department. This predominantly affects certificate program enrollments, as they tend to be secondary programs.
