Kentucky Gamma maintains current test materials on file in the AED room for use by members and associates.

This non-credit course is taught every spring by chemistry professor, Dr. Lowell Shank. This class includes sample tests, interview tips, and study guidelines for succeeding on the admission exams.

AED members organize a MCAT study group every spring for students who plan on taking the spring MCAT exam.

Every year AED organizes a meeting with first year medical students who have graduated from the Kentucky Gamma Chapter and other AED members who have been accepted to professional schools to discuss their experiences and to counsel others on what it takes to make it to medical school.

Officer Transition Meetings

Every year AED holds a meeting to allow the new officers for the next year to talk to the old officers about their newly appointed positions.

Communication

Kentucky Gamma's major publication is a handbook entitled <u>Freshmen</u> <u>Orientation</u>. This publication contains information about the Kentucky Gamma Chapter, how to prepare for the MCAT and DAT, admission requirements for professional schools and information on how to apply to the schools.

The AED room provides Kentucky Gamma members with a place to study and a convenient way to stay abreast of AED happenings through a bulletin board posted with announcements and a copy of the minutes from the last meeting.

Fliers are frequently posted throughout the science complex to announce AED meetings and other activities.

Letters are sent to associates to keep them informed of their membership status, and members receive letters if they miss meetings so as to encourage them to regularly attend meetings.

Alumni receive the Annual Alumni Newsletter each year to inform them of Kentucky Gamma Chapter activities and the pre-professional program in general.
