CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Student Government Association was called to order at 5:00 pm by Vice-President Jeff Yan.

OFFICER REPORTS

Tara Higdon, President--President Higdon reported that the BSBP Conference she attended this past weekend was very well-planned and had excellent speakers, although it was poorly attended. In mid-October, SGA is tentatively planning a rally to be held here at Western on Higher Education Funding, along with other universities in the state. President Higdon also announced that in the Commencement Committee meeting held on Sept. 6, it was approved by President Meredith that there will be a December graduation. At the Board of Regents Retreat this past Sept. 10-12, there were a lot of great ideas generated and many things were accomplished. President Higdon also noted that the Code of Ethics has not yet been approved and is available to whomever wants a copy. It will be discussed Sept. 22, at the Board of Regents Meeting.

Jeff Yan, Vice-President--Vice-President Yan passed around a sign-up sheet for Congress members to work the Voter Registration Drive. Members must sign up for at least two one-hour shifts. Vice-President Yan also needed the newly elected Freshman Council and the new Residence Hall representatives to stay after to be sworn in.

Kristen Miller, Public Relations Director--Public Relations Director Miller announced that she sent the letter to the Advertising Dept. requesting assistance for a possible new SGA ad campaign. She also sent a letter to the Government Dept. to see if visiting classrooms to talk about SGA would be feasible. SGA is also planning to visit all social organizations and fraternities and sororities to speak on SGA's behalf and also to talk about the Pep Rally which will be Sept. 22. Brandon Rucker, Treasurer--Total expenditures for the week were \$222.54. The account balance is now \$35,409.38. Total expenditures thus far have been \$6,344.62. Organizational Aid applications will be available in the SGA office on Monday, Sept. 18, 1995. We will be giving the entire budgeted \$4,500.00 this fall instead of half in the fall and half in the spring. The applications will be due Wednesday, Oct. 4, 1995. Interviews will be scheduled after the applications are turned in. Treasurer Rucker announced that the retreat is this weekend and that Committee Heads and Executive Council will be going to Rough River on Friday night. Everyone will be leaving at 4p.m. from the SGA office. Transportation will be provided. The rest of Congress who are to be there on Saturday, will be leaving at noon from the SGA office. Again, transportation will be provided. If a member of Congress who signed up doesn't show, they will be charged for the amount of the room that is reserved. Treasurer Rucker asked that everyone please check the sign-up sheet one more time to make sure if they were signed up or if their name needs to be taken off the list. He also asked that Congress members bring their Congress notebooks, pen or pencil, and paper to the retreat.
