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MINUTES

Council of Academic Deans
July 24, 1979

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. by Dr. James L. Davis. Deans in attendance were Nelson, Hardin, Chelf, Cravens, Sutton, Gray, Stroube, Robinson. Mr. John Oakes attended for Dean Mounce; Dr. Kenneth Brenner attended for Dean Sandefur; Dr. L. D. Brown attended for Dean Russell; Mr. Michael Rush attended for Dean Hourigan.

The minutes of the July 3, 1979, meeting were approved as distributed.

Dr. Nelson expressed the need to have printed on class rolls the reference number of each student's major program. The Nelson-Stroube motion that the deans approve the printing on class rolls of the reference number of each student's major was passed.

Dr. Davis called attention to the article on CEUs which was attached to the agenda. Discussion included the lack of uniformity in the kinds of experience for which CEUs are awarded and in the charge for recording CEUs.

Dr. Davis mentioned the planned faculty meeting for fall (on August 22) and provided information concerning the all-day deans' meeting to be held. Deans should send to Dr. Robinson by August 8 any item for the agenda. The date was changed to August 21 (Tuesday) because of conflicts with other events on the 22nd. Each dean should provide a summary of his annual report so copies can be distributed to all the academic deans prior to the meeting.

The Owensboro consortium was discussed.

Dr. Hardin distributed information concerning interest in TV courses. He urged the deans to give serious consideration to Western's offering credit for TV courses.

Dr. Cravens reported on Western's planned booth at the Local Issues Conference to be held July 24-26 in Louisville. Agency heads, etc., from over the state will be present. Deans may submit to Dr. Cravens any materials they wish to place on display.

Dr. Nelson reported that E.K.U. has dropped all associate degree programs in business because of the difficulties the programs create in gaining accreditation. Dr. Nelson stated that he attempts to avoid such problems by separating associate degree students from baccalaureate students in business programs.

Dr. Davis mentioned that he will be away from campus July 25 through August 7 and that Drs. Stroube and Robinson will have full authority for decision-making during his absence.

Dr. Sutton reported a summer 1979 increase of about 5000 credit hours over summer 1978. The meeting was adjourned at 10:20 a.m.
