

Minutes of Board Meeting

March 25, 1950

At a called meeting of the Board of Regents of the Western Kentucky State College on March 25, 1950, at 10:00 A.M. in the office of President Paul L. Garrett, there were present vice-chairman John E. Richardson, Judge Clarence Bartlett, and Mr. J. P. Masters, all members of the Board.

In the absence of State Superintendent Boswell B. Hodgkin, ex-officio chairman, Mr. John E. Richardson called the meeting to order and presided.

President Garrett then read the minutes of the meeting of the Board on September 24, 1949, and October 1, 1949. Mr. Maurice Ingram and Mr. John Wilson, architects, appeared before the Board in response to a request of the President that plans be suggested for reducing estimated costs of the new Student Union Building. It was suggested that two stories of the Building be built with provisions for the third story to be added at some later date. It was agreed by the members of the Board and the President that this would probably be the proper action unless additional funds should be secured.

On motion of Mr. Bartlett, with a second by Mr. Masters, and with all members voting "aye", Mr. Richardson declared the meeting was adjourned.
