#### Minutes of Board Meeting

September 24, 1949

The Board of Regents of Western Kentucky State College met in the office of President Paul L. Garrett on Saturday afternoon, September 24, 1949, at 2:30 P.M. There were present: Mr. Boswell Hodgkin, State Superintendent of Public Instruction and ex-officio chairman of the Board, Mr. John Richardson, Mr. Vernon Shallcross, Mr. Clarence Bartlett, and Mr. J. P. Masters.

Chairman Hodgkin declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

President Garrett read the minutes of the Board meeting on April 25, 1949. Upon motion of Mr. Shallcross, with a second by Mr. Masters, with all members voting "aye" the minutes were approved and adopted as read.

President Garrett read a letter from Attorney General A. E. Funk approving the employment of Mr. Nelson Ferry. Below is a copy of the letter. He also read a letter from Governor Earle C. Clements acknowledging his report of the plans being made toward determining responsibility of the shortage.

President Garrett reported that under the authorization of the Board of Regents at its meeting on April 25, 1949, he had employed Mr. Nelson Perry of the Department of Revenue as an investigator for the purposes of determining, if possible, the individual or individuals responsible for the shortages in college accounts. It was moved by Mr. Richardson with a second by Mr. Bartlett that the action of President Garrett in the employment of Nelson Perry be approved. The vote was as follows: Mr. Shallcross, aye; Mr. Masters, aye; Mr. Richardson, aye; Mr. Bartlett, aye; Mr. Hodgkin, aye.

J. T. Orendorf, Commonwealth's Attorney, and Mr. Riordan, assistant state auditor, appeared before the Board at this time to report on the progress of an investigation being made to determine responsibilities of a deficit in the college accounts.

It was moved by Mr. Shallcross with a second by Mr. Richardson that President Garrett be authorized to secure from the State Auditor's Office and such other sources as he might deem competent advice regarding

improvements which could be made in the accounting system of the business office of the college, and that on the basis of recommendations for improvement, if such were made, that President Garrett be authorized to make such improvements in the accounting system subject to ratification of the Board. All members voting "aye" the motion was unanimously passed.

J. M. Ingram, Architect, of Bowling Green and Louisville appeared before the Board at this time on behalf of himself and John Wilson of Lexington. The President stated that their work on the new dormitory had been satisfactory.

A motion was made by Mr. Shallcross with a second by Mr. Bartlett authorizing the Executive Committee to employ an architect to draw preliminary plans in connection with the construction of a Student Union Building subject to the ratification of the Board. All members voting "aye" the motion was unanimously adopted.

On motion of Mr. Masters, with a second by Mr. Richardson, all members voting "aye", the President was authorized to employ such additional members of the staff as might be required to fill such vacancies as may arise subject to the ratification of the Board at its next meeting.

On recommendation of the President a motion was made by Mr. Richardson with a second by Mr. Bartlett, that all changes in personnel, viz., employment, resignations, changes in rate of pay, and leaves of absence, as cleared through the Department of Finance on the recommendation of the President since the last meeting of the Board on April 25, 1949, be approved and ratified. #### Minutes of Board Meeting

October 1, 1949

At a called meeting of the Board of Regents of the Western Kentucky State College on October 1, 1949, at 10:00 A. M., in the office of President Paul L. Garrett, there were present vice-chairman, Mr. John Richardson, Judge Clarence Bartlett, Mr. Vernon Shallcross, and Mr. J. P. Masters.

In the absence of State Superintendent of Instruction, Mr. Boswell Hodgkin, ex-officio chairman, Mr. Richardson, vice-chairman, called the meeting to order and presided.

On the recommendation of the President, Mr. Bartlett moved with a second by Mr. Masters that Ingram & Wilson be elected as architects for the proposed Student Union Building subject to the approval of the Division of Engineering of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. All members voting "aye" the motion was unanimously adopted.

On recommendation of the President a motion was made by Mr. Masters with second by Mr. Shallcross that Roy Harris and Johana Harris be elected members of the music department faculty at a salary of \$1250.00 each for the 1949-50 school year. All members voting "aye" the motion was declared adopted.

On motion of Mr. Bartlett with second by Mr. Masters, Mr. Fred Spires of the American National Bank was elected treasurer of the College without compensation until further order of the Board. All members voting "aye" the motion was unanimously adopted.
