During the use of the leased premises by the City Board of Education as herein provided, the City Board shall be in full and complete control thereof, with the same responsibility to persons on such leased premises as if said premises were owned in fee by the City Board.

A second was made by Judge Bartlett, and all members voting "aye" the motion was declared carried.

President Garrett then submitted a suggested list of salary raises for members of the staff with the request that he be authorized to put them into effect as of September 1 upon approval of the Executive Committee. Judge Dawson moved that the Executive Committee be authorized to make such changes, the same to be ratified at the next meeting of the Board of Regents. After a second by Mr. Borrone the vote was as follows: Judge Dawson, aye; Judge Bartlett, aye; Mr. Borrone, aye; Superintendent Williams, aye.

On motion of Mr. Borrone with a second by Judge Dawson and with all members voting "aye" the meeting was adjourned.

Minutes of Board Meeting

September 28, 1946

A meeting of the Board of Regents of Western Kentucky State Teachers College was held in the offices of Woodward, Dawson, Hobson & Fulton, Kentucky Home Life Building, Louisville, Kentucky, at 11:00 A.M., C.S.T.

In the absence of Chairman, John Fred Williams, the Vice-Chairman, B. J. Borrone, called the meeting to order. Judge Rodes and Judge Dawson were present. There were also present at the meeting Landscape Architect Tom Nelson and Building Architects John Wilson and Maurice Ingram.

On motion of Judge Rodes, with second by Judge Dawson, President Garrett was elected Secretary of the meeting. All members voting "aye" the motion was carried.

The Secretary read the Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Regents on August 10, 1946, and reported that in accordance with instructions to the Executive Committee at that meeting regarding the contract with the architects, that Paragraph Three had been deleted as requested by the Board and with that change the contract had been signed by the President and the Chairman of the Executive Committee. He also reported that the City Board of Education of Bowling Green had agreed that the clause, suggested in a motion by Judge Dawson and adopted by the Board, vesting in the City Board of Education the same responsibility to persons on the leased athletic field of the College during the period of their use as if said premises were owned in fee by the City Board be added to the lease contract and the Secretary submitted to the Board the addition to the Lease Contract as signed by the President and the Secretary of the City Board. On motion of Judge Dawson with a second by Judge Rodes with all members of the Board voting "aye" the minutes were ratified and approved as read.

The Secretary next read the minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee on September 9, 1946:

Meeting of Executive Committee

September 9, 1946

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Regents was held September 9, 1946, in the office of President Garrett. Those present were: B. J. Borrone, Chairman; Judge Rodes; and President Garrett.

President Garrett presented the matter of the contemplated purchase of the Rock House including furnishings of rooms for rent for the amount of \$28,000.00. He stated that he and Mr. Borrone had examined the property and considered it a good purchase. It was agreed that a meeting of the Board of Regents should be called as soon as possible in order that the recommendation of the Executive Committee might be considered.

President Garrett moved that the cost of season athletic tickets be added to the entrance fee. A second was made by Judge Rodes, and all present voting "aye" the motion was declared adopted.

President Garrett then presented the list of faculty members for whom increases in salary were considered at the last meeting of the Board of Regents in which some changes had been made to

more nearly equalize the teaching salaries with the recommendations that the salaries be put into effect September 1 subject to ratification of the Board of Regents at their next meeting. On motion of President Garrett with second by Judge Rodas, and all members voting "aye", the recommendation was adopted.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Judge Dawson moved that the action of the Executive Committee as reflected by the minutes of the meeting be ratified and approved. The voting was as follows: Mr. Berrone, aye; Judge Dawson, aye; Judge Rodas, aye.

Judge Rodes moved that the salary schedule as submitted be adopted. With a second by Judge Dawson the voting was as follows: Mr. Borrone, aye; Judge Dawson, aye; Judge Rodes, aye.

President Garrett next submitted the recommendation that the property known as the Rock House which had been inspected by him and Mr. Borrone with the opinion that it was a proper purchase, be purchased by the college. He also submitted a deed and abstract for the property signed by the owners, S. T. Rabold, Sr., and his wife, Mary A. Rabold. Judge Dawson moved that the purchase of the Rock House property, real estate, fixtures, furniture, and furnishings, exclusive of furniture and furnishings now in rooms occupied by the present owners, for \$28000 be authorized. After a second by Judge Rodes the voting was as follows: Judge Rodes, aye; Mr. Borrone, aye; Judge Dawson, aye.

At this time a discussion was made by the architects and members of the Board. The architects requested that they be authorized to make preliminaries or preferably complete plans and specifications for a building worth approximately \$400,000 in order that the \$200,000 available under State appropriation might be used to the best advantage. No agreement was reached regarding this request.

President Garrett read a proposal from Will S. Covington that approximately 220 acres of his farm adjoining the College Farm be leased to the college at a rent of \$1850 per year. After some discussion it was agreed that this matter should be left to the discretion of the Executive Committee.

On recommendation of President Garrett, Judge Dawson moved that he be authorized to make application to the Division of Vocational Education for reimbursement in the amount of \$200.00 on a total amount of \$300.00 to be paid Susie Pate, teacher of home economics in the Training School, for teaching a part-time and an evening class for veterans' wives. After a second by Mr. Borrone the vote was as follows: Judge Rodes, aye; Mr. Borrone, aye; Judge Dawson, aye.

President Garrett stated that he thought it desirable to make application to the Federal Works Agency for educational furniture and supplies in order that a larger number of veterans might be given the educational opportunities desired. Judge Rodes moved the adoption of the following resolution which, after a second by Judge Dawson, with all members voting "aye", was declared adopted.

Resolution

RESOLUTION authorizing the Filing of an Application with the United States of America for Provision of Veterans' Educational Facilities, and designating and authorizing a Representative.

WHEREAS, Western Kentucky State Teachers College (herein called the "Applicant"), acting by and through its governing body, upon the basis of available data, has found that there exists or impends an acute shortage of educational facilities required for persons engaged in the pursuit of courses of training or education under Title II of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, as amended, and to relieve such shortage proposes to request the United States of America through the Bureau of Community Facilities, Federal Works Agency, (herein called the "Government"), to provide educational facilities, pursuant to Public Law 697, 79th Congress, (Section 504 of the Lanham Act, as amended), and in connection therewith, has examined and considered such law, the Regulations, the Information for Applicants, the form of application and the form of proposed agreement:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Regents of the Applicant (herein called the "Governing Body") that a justification of need and that an application or applications be filed, in such form as may be required by the Government, to provide such educational facilities as are required to alleviate such acute shortage, and that the Applicant will comply with the various requirements and conditions necessary to enable the Government to provide such facilities, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Paul L. Garrett is hereby designated as the Applicant's Representative and is authorized in his capacity as such Representative to file with the Government a justification of need and an application or applications to negotiate, execute, and enter into an agreement or agreements with the Government in substantially the form of agreement considered by the Governing Body, to negotiate, execute and enter into such other agreements and instruments and to perform and do any and all acts as may be necessary to provide a suitable site and site preparation, streets or roadways, sidewalks, landscaping, utility mains, technical or engineering data, architectural or engineering services, necessary rights of entry and rights of way for Government operations, to accept on behalf of the Applicant ownership and possession of such facilities, to assure the Government that such facilities will be utilized by the Applicant to carry out the purposes of such law, and to do or perform any and all other acts that are necessary to accomplish the purposes of the Applicant's application, to perform the Applicant's obligations under its agreement with the Government, and to obtain the provision of such facilities.

I, the undersigned, the duly qualified and acting Secretary of the Board of Regents of Western Kentucky State Teachers College (herein called the "Applicant") and the keeper of the records of the Applicant, including the journal of proceedings of the Board of Regents (herein called the "Governing Body"), do hereby certify:

1. That the attached Resolution For Veterans Educational Facilities, (herein called the "Resolution"), is a true and correct copy of the Resolution as finally adopted at a meeting of the Governing Body held on the 28 day of September 1946 and duly recorded in my office;

2. That said meeting was duly convened and held in all respects in accordance with law and to the extent required by law due and proper notice of such meeting was given; and a legal quorum was present throughout the meeting, and a legally sufficient number of members of the Governing Body voted in the proper manner and for the adoption of said

Resolution; that all other requirements and proceedings under the law incident to the proper adoption or passage of said Resolution, including publication, if required, have been duly fulfilled, carried out, and otherwise observed; and that I am authorized to execute this certificate.

3. That if an impression of a seal has been affixed below, it constitutes the official seal of the Applicant and this certificate is hereby executed under such official seal; but if no seal has been affixed, the Applicant does not have an official seal.
