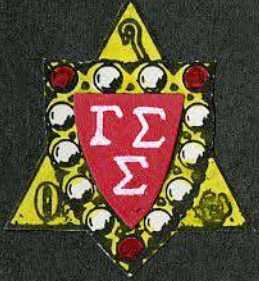

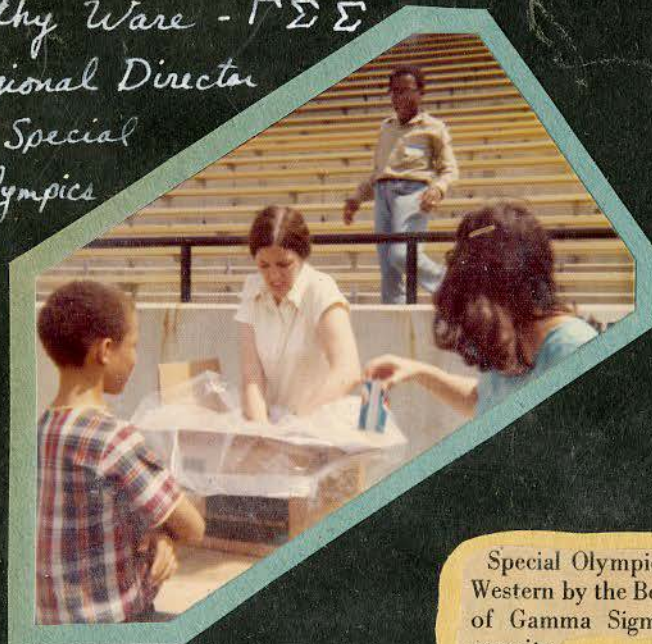

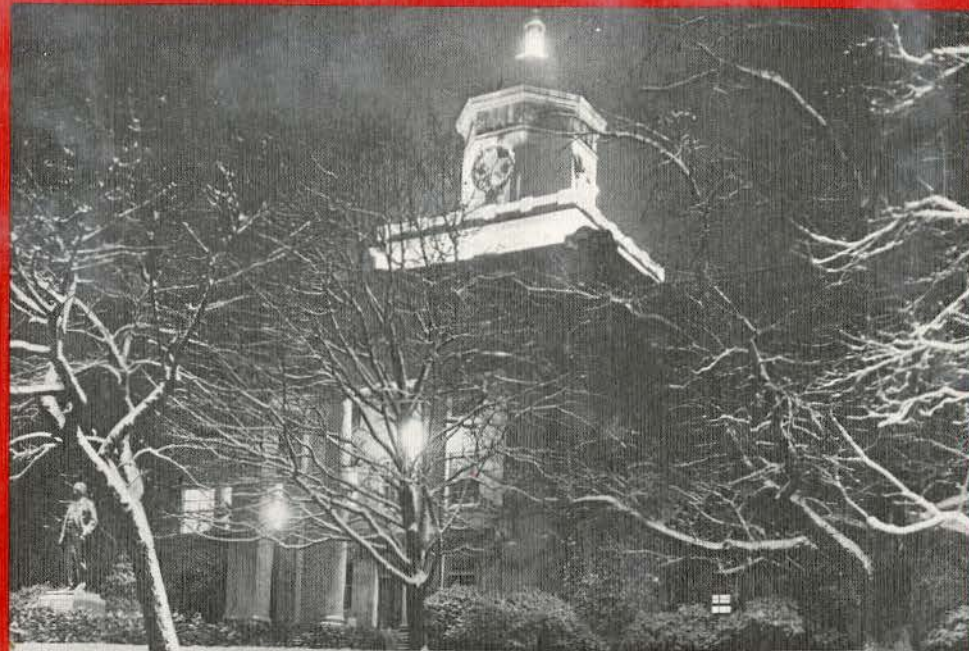
The name of the games is "Special Olympics," and is part of a nationwide program of sports training and athletic competition for the handicapped of all ages.
