These are just a few of the many letters that we have received from you associates. Everyone has expressed his desire to help, and everyone has felt that we will keep Camp. With such spirit as this we know that Camp will be saved.

If I may say so, we here at home, are not standing idle, waiting for you to save us. We are, in every way possible, trying to raise money. Last Saturday, believe it or not, we had a rummage sale on Main Street. We made \$31.00. A week after Thanksgiving we are having another sale. This time we expect an even higher return.

Work by the pledges and ourselves is going on as usual at Camp. Today the County is grading our hill and we are painting the Club House. In every way we are trying to do our best to keep going. And in every way, I believe that the spirit of the Club is at its highest.
