Dear Brothers,

In representing the brothers as Alumni Chairman for Kentucky Beta chapter, I have attempted to form a brief news-letter to better inform you, the alumni, about some of our chapter's recent achievements and operations and to inform you on some upcoming events.

The new officers for the spring semester will be John Minton, son of Dr. and Mrs. John Minton, Vice-President for Administrative Affairs for Western Kentucky University. John is serving as E.
