Buy-A-Book Program for Spring 2007 Semester

WHEREAS: Through a formal publicity campaign, the Student Government Association will attain a higher application entry level than in past years consequently increasing the number of students who apply significantly, and

WHEREAS: A scholarship selection committee, selected and chaired by the Academic Affairs Chairman, shall be made up of one faculty member, The Student Government Director of Student and Academic Affairs or his designate, one Student Senator, and three Academic Affairs committee members; one of which is not in Student Senate, shall sit on the selection committee, and

WHEREAS: An application, which is attached, will aid in the selection of the said worthy students, and

WHEREAS: The applying process shall begin no later than November 20th 2006, and end no sooner than December 1st 2006, and the selection committee will meet during the week of December 4th 2006

1. All students applying for the Buy-A-Book service must have an application on file with the Student Government Association by the deadline.
2. Applicants must be full-time students (enrolled in 12 hours or more) for the semester in which they apply.
3. In the event the student does not remain enrolled throughout the entirety of the semester, the books must be returned to the Student Government Association Office.
4. The books must be purchased through the College Heights Bookstore and will be inter-accounted with SGA. No cash will be given; this will be for the strict use of books alone.
5. Recipients of the Buy-A-Book service may keep the books at the end of the semester.
6. Once an applicant is awarded the service, he/she is not eligible to ever receive the service again.
7. Any falsification on the application will automatically be grounds for rejection.

Request a sign at the intersection of College Heights Boulevard and College Street
