Since Halloween is this month, the good of Video VaultKeeper has a few good fright flicks sure to liven up the "deadest" (no pun intended) of Halloween Parties:





Video Vaultkeeper's picks of the month-


Wrestling Women Vs. the Aztec Mummy-This is about just what the title says. Ya gotta see it to believe it!
