Representing Epsilon Delta were Irene Erskine, Chapter Advisor, Jennifer Hayden, President, and Natalie Bowlds, Rush Chairman. A special honor came when Governor Mecham proclaimed June 21-25, ADPi Week in Arizona.

Along with various workshops and meetings, election of officers to the Grand Council were conducted. The results were as follows: Grand President, Jane Madio; Grand V.P. of Collegiate Chapter Performance, Margaret Bundy; Grand V.P. of Collegiate Chapter Programs, Beth Mannle; Grand V.P. of Collegiate Chapter Expansion, Maryann Gillespie; Grand V.P. of Alumnae, Betty Riley; Grand Secretary, Joan LeBarron; Grand Treasurer, Ann Havenhill.

The 1987 Grand Convention provided a chance to experience the history of Alpha Delta Pi and expand upon its traditions. The workshops ranging from Alcohol Awareness to Alumnae Service, were very informative and covered issues relevant to today.

Throughout the week Epsilon Delta was recognized for its outstanding accomplishments in numerous areas. These included the A-1 Treasurer Award and for the sixth consecutive year, Diamond 4-Point. Now only lacking one major award, Epsilon Delta is anxiously looking toward the Golden Lion Hall of Fame. Final Awards Night brought more honors as the chapter received the award for having 80 percent or higher on chapter evaluations, as well as receiving Diamond 4-Point two years in a row. Another award recognized Epsilon Delta's accomplishments in pledging 50 percent or more of the ADPi legacies who go through Rush.

The 136th Anniversary Convention proved to be an inspiring and educational experience which was a source of pride to all in attendance.

WINNING TRADITION

1986-87 proved to be another busy and exciting year for Epsilon Delta as they once again upheld their winning tradition on the Hill. They started the fall semester with a bang by placing first for the second year in a row in Pike's Peak Week. Not only did they win the overall event, but proved they enjoyed doing so by also receiving the Spirit Award. KD Washboard offered a chance to showcase some of ADPi's talent, and they were thrilled to win first place. Amy Biggs and Misty Brey did a wonderful job putting together the country and western show entitled "The Ya'll Come Back Saloon." ADPi's school spirit was very evident as they captured the Spirit Award at Big Red's Roar and cheered on Cathy Brown as she was named first runner-up for 1986 Homecoming Queen.

The annual Academic Banquet was an exciting time for Epsilon Delta as they were recognized for their many scholastic achievements this past year. These included placing first overall among sororities for highest GPA, and receiving an award for Outstanding Academic Achievement in 1986. Sisters Carol Williams and Lee Anne Murray received awards for the highest GPA among Greek women in their respective classes. Realizing the importance of scholarships, Epsilon Delta was very honored to receive these awards.



Placing first in the 1986 Sigma Chi Derby was another highlight for the spring semester. ADPi raised over \$1,500.00 for the local Potter Home and School and the Ronald McDonald House. The 1986-87 school year ended with the chapter's participation in Greek Week. ADPi took part in every event, placing third overall with first place finishes in Tug-of-War and the Bed Race. Congratulations, Epsilon Delta, on another outstanding year!

ADPi'S RECOGNIZED FOR OUTSTANDING INTERGREEK RELATIONS

Positive relations among Greeks on Western's campus has always been a top priority for Epsilon Delta and this year was definitely no exception. We were recognized for our achievements in this area at the 1987 Greek Week Awards Convocation when we received an award for Outstanding Intergreek Relations.

This award was partially based on our very strong leadership position in Western's Panhellenic Association. Melinda York has led the way in his area by serving as First Vice President of Panhellenic Council. The current Panhellenic Treasurer, Sherri Brown, and last year's Public Relations Chairperson, Natalie Bowlds, have also helped ADPi gain its current standing in Panhellenic. These sisters, as well as Rhonda Hamilton, our Panhellenic Representative, have done an excellent job.

Our strong Panhellenic spirit has also been evident in our participation in various Panhellenic sponsored activities. This past spring we were involved in a Sister Sorority Program. Our sister sorority was Sigma Kappa. Their chapter reorganized this last fall and we supported them in many different ways throughout the semester. Another Panhellenic event was a sorority floor swap. This proved to be a lot of fun as members of different sororities stayed with each other overnight in order to learn a little more about what each sisterhood is all about.

ADPi has participated in all Panhellenic sponsored events this past year. These included the Academic Banquet, Pledge Olympics, Greek Week, and the Greek Symposium, which was chaired by our own Melinda York.

Our involvement in Panhellenic will continue to be a top priority for Epsilon Delta. We realize how essential good intergreek relations are for a strong Greek system on Western's campus.

# PHILANTHROPIC: TOP PRIORITY

The Epsilon Delta Chapter of Alpha Delta Pi has done it again! They have contributed countless hours of service to the local community, the University, and other organizations this past year.

In addition to hosting the annual ADPi Football Classic for the Ronald McDonald House, members helped raise money for the American Diabetes Association, Wallace Village for Children, the Potter Home and School, and United Cerebral Palsy. They also raised more than any other sorority when participating in "Bowl for Kid's Sake" for Big Brothers and Sisters of Bowling Green. Epsilon Delta raised over \$3000 for these and other very worthwhile causes this past year.

Bowling Green has certainly benefited from ADPi members volunteering for the Elderly Assistance Program, Halloween Safety Patrol, decorating Fountain Square for Christmas, and caring for Covington Woods Park.

Western also appreciates the efforts of ADPi on campus. After all, they raised \$4230 during last year's Alumni Phonothon, participated in the Student Recruitment Phonothon, Hands Across Western, and hosted the annual Favorite Professor's Tea.

Since adopting the houses as their national philanthropy in 1979, Alpha Delta Pi Collegiate Chapters, Alumnae Associations and individual members have contributed one million dollars to this wonderful project.

The gifts have been made possible by the many creative and varied fund-raising events held in local communities and on college campuses. The Epsilon Delta Chapter on the campus of Western Kentucky University raised \$1000 during their annual ADPi Football Classic this past September. They also contributed over \$800 toward the Playwall for the 100th Ronald McDonald House. This money was raised during Coaches Ransom which is a fund-raising project part of Sigma Chi Fraternity's annual Sigma Chi Derby.

These funds have been distributed to all of the houses open and operating in the United States and Canada. Over 100 houses are now open and many are under renovation or construction for future opening.

## Alumnae Service Program

Three new Alumnae Service projects were introduced during the 1987 Convention. A brand new program, Alpha Alert, is being developed to help graduating seniors in the job search process. It will involve contact between seniors and alumnae who could be of assistance. Another new program, Alpha Advise, will be aimed at those alumnae who are relocating or considering a move. This service will provide general information about various cities and states which will enable ADPi's to better acquaint themselves with new areas.

The third program, which is now in full swing, is Alpha Advantage. This is designed to provide a facility to put members in touch with other ADPi's for career/employment connections, vocational contacts, and family/life information and support. The program is set up to involve all ADPi alumnae as well as collegians who choose to participate. It serves as a link between ADPi's entering or reentering the job force for advice and help on jobs and referrals. ADPi's are able to take advantage of each other's services such as real estate, interior design, doctors, dentists, etc. With so many women working in the U.S. today, this type of "networking" can be very valuable. The success of this program depends on the participation of many ADPi's.
