7.3 Recommendation to file an application for an FM repeater station to be located at Reed, Kentucky.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

President Zacharias recommends that Western Kentucky University file an application for an FM repeater station to be located at Reed near Henderson, Kentucky. Western will work cooperatively to determine ways of sharing programming and operating costs with Murray State University and Henderson Community College. Major funding for this project will come from funds generated in the listening area.

#### BACKGROUND:

Exhibits B-1 and C-1 from the application to the FCC provide information regarding a proposed noncommercial, educational FM repeater station in the Henderson, Kentucky, area. In 1978, Western Kentucky University applied for an FM station in the Owensboro area. Shortly after that action, Murray State University applied for a competing channel in the Henderson area. The FCC would not grant a license to both stations. As a result of considerable argument over the effort to obtain the licenses in these two communities, Western Kentucky University and Murray State University Boards of Regents agreed to withdraw the applications and declare a moratorium on action on both campuses for two years. That period of moratorium expired in 1983.

If we could be assured that a channel would remain available in the Henderson-Owensboro area for several years, we would not be proposing action at this time. Unfortunately, a broadcasting group in Evansville, Indiana, has filed for one of the final channels available for serving the area listed above. Due to the alertness of Dr. Charles Anderson, Western was made aware of the action by the Evansville group in time to file a request with the FCC. We did not have sufficient time to enter into discussion with Murray State University and Henderson Community College in time to make a specific proposal regarding a cooperative effort in establishing the station. We have, however, contacted both the President of Murray State University and the Director of the Henderson Community College and told them about our options. We anticipate that Dr. Charles Anderson, representing Western Kentucky University, will enter into discussions with the appropriate representatives of the two other institutions for the purpose of determining how this activity can be shared. We propose a repeater station operation that would be similar to our station near Somerset, Kentucky, which will go on the air later this fall.

The success of this project will depend upon our ability to raise funds in the area to be served and in using money that comes from other than university appropriated dollars. This represents an important opportunity for Western to work cooperatively with other universities and to provide a significant service to an area currently not served by a local national public broadcasting station.

The proposed non-commercial educational FM radio station will serve to reinforce and extend the University's educational mission.

Specifically, the radio station, (WKYU-FM, Bowling Green, KY) functions primarily in the public service and instructional components of the educational mission. It will provide programming in the performing arts, public affairs and news closely related to existing University instructional and service programs. A significant part of the station's programming will feature performance by students, faculty, and visiting artists, including a University-based symphony orchestra. In the area of public affairs programming, the faculty of most departments are already involved in programs dealing with regional problems. Other faculty members regularly present programs dealing with health, government, economics, agriculture, environmental problems, etc. A large amount of instructional programming (i.e., formal credit courses) has not been proposed; rather, it is expected that a significant amount of non-credit and continuing education activities will be broadcast.

Western Kentucky University will enter into discussions with Murray State University, Licensee of WKMS, Murray, Kentucky, regarding the joint programming of the proposed station. As the results of the discussions are available, amendments will be filed to this application with respect to purpose and proposed programming

#### Exhibit C-1:

# Purpose:

It is the purpose and objective of Western Kentucky University in proposing to establish a non-commercial educational FM radio station in Henderson, Kentucky, to fulfill its stated educational mission as a state university of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (see Exhibit B-1). This is expected to occur primarily in the educational function of instruction and public service with the greatest emphasis on the public service component.

A considerable amount of performing arts programming will be broadcast, specifically programs involving performances by students, faculty and regional musicians, plus the performances of a number of distinguished visiting guest artists. Performances will range from the traditional music of rural Kentucky to jazz and classical presentations. The broadcast of performing arts programs extends the University's role in serving the cultural needs of its community and service region in Kentucky. The area of the proposed Henderson station is presently without a primary (lmv/m) signal from a Kentucky non-commercial educational radio station. The proposed Henderson station will provide this service to a large area served by Western Kentucky University.

Western Kentucky University will enter into discussions with Murray State University (licensee of WKMS-FM in Murray, Kentucky) regarding cooperative programming of the proposed station in the immediate future. As results of those negotiations are available, appropriate amendments will be filed to the proposed programming and other relevant sections of the application.

# Program Policy:

The station will rely heavily on talented performers from its region of service, plus university faculty and staff and knowledgeable individuals from the region. It is proposed that in providing

a non-commercial educational FM radio service to the Henderson, Kentucky, area, provisions will be made for the origination of localized news and public service programming.

# Editorial Policy:

The proposed station will refrain from editorializing on any issue or endorsing any candidate for public office.

#### Fairness:

The station will encourage the presentation of all significant viewpoints on items of a controversial nature to the extent of seeking qualified spokespersons for the major points of view of each issue. The proposed Henderson station will adhere to the "Fairness Doctrine."

Mrs. Wilson moved and Mr. Cook seconded a motion for adoption of recommendation as submitted. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mrs. Carol Palmore, the wife of Judge Palmore and a native of Owensboro, was recognized by Chairman Iracane.

Concluding comments were heard from the Board members as follows:

- Mr. Cook welcomed the two new members of the Board and expressed appreciation to the outgoing members, Mr. Joe Bill Campbell and Mr. Ronald Sheffer, for the outstanding service provided to the Board during their tenures. "The things they were able to do for this University will live a lot longer than any tenure on any board. I just hope that we can all distinguish ourselves in the same manner as we go along," he said.
- Mr. Page added his welcome to Mr. Butler and Judge Palmore.
- Mr. Butler thanked everyone for the warm hospitality shown him during his first meeting of the Board of Regents. "I'm certainly looking forward to working with all the members in the forthcoming months. I am proud to be on this Board and look forward to seeing what we can get accomplished in the next few months and years."
- Mrs. Miller said, "I'm very happy to meet the new Board members, delighted they are here, and look forward to getting to know them." In addition, Mrs. Miller congratulated Mr. Iracane on chairing the meeting.
- Mrs. Wilson welcomed the two new members, added her congratulations to Mr. Iracane, and extended her best wishes to President Zacharias on his trip to Thailand.
- $\frac{ ext{Mrs. Judd}}{ ext{and Judge Palmore.}}$  echoed the welcome of other Board members to Mr. Butler
- Judge Palmore expressed appreciation for the kind remarks and said, "I'm looking forward to working with the Board."
- Mr. Iracane noted that, 'Western Kentucky University is sort of like a family. We have had changes in our family, but I think the addition of Danny Butler and Judge Palmore is good for our family. It's an honor to have both of them on this Board. We're all friends and family, and it's in the Western tradition that we all stick together and work for the betterment of the University."

Dr. Dero G. Downing, President Emeritus, Western Kentucky University; and President of the College Heights Foundation was invited to make comments. Dr. Downing stated, "I'm flattered that you'd suggest that I'd have anything

worthwhile to contribute to this group! It's always an honor to be in the presence of the distinguished members of this Board of Regents. I've had the privilege and pleasure of knowing Judge Palmore for forty-some-odd years, and I've known Danny Butler almost that long. I've known him since he was born, and he's not quite forty yet, so my relationship with them has been, as it has been with other members of this Board and many of you, one of friendship, which I've appreciated and enjoyed. I would extend to each of them an invitation to come to the College Heights Foundation at any time they are on the campus. The Foundation is a private corporation, founded in 1923; and I was provided the opportunity to serve there after stepping down as President of the University. I hope that, in some way in the years ahead that we in the Foundation can make a meaningful contribution to Western Kentucky University. My wife and I have four children who have graduated from Western Kentucky University; we have a son who will be beginning here this fall, so we have more than just a passing interest in what goes on in this body."

It was noted that the terms of two members of the Board would be expiring prior to the next regular meeting. Joe Cook said, "Rather than say farewell, we'll say that we look forward to working with you all for the benefit of this University in the future regardless of any reappointment or not. We know that you are loyal to this University and have served it very well, and all of us who have served with you appreciate the contributions you have made."

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
