## MINUTES

Meeting  
Council of Academic Deans  
April 5, 1994


Dr. Robert V. Haynes called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.. Members present included: Drs. David D. Lee, Ronnie N. Sutton, Martin R. Houston, Carl R. Martray, John H. Petersen, and Livingston Alexander. Dr. Marvin Leavy represented Dr. Michael B. Binder and Dr. Robert Bretz represented Dr. J. Michael Brown.

Dr. Haynes presented a brief report on a legislative update sent by Dr. Gary Cox to all state higher education institutions. The update displayed the proposed budget appropriations for the state institutions as recommended by the Governor, House of Representatives, the Senate, and the Conference Committee.

The attention of the Council was then focused on out-of-state tuition waivers for graduate students as Dr. Martray proposed that departments be allowed to award limited stipends to out-of-state students even though the out-of-state tuition is not waived. After a lengthy discussion, Dr. Haynes suggested that the awarding of out-of-state tuition waivers should be tied to academic merit in order to make the best use of limited resources. The Council agreed that a formula for appropriate distribution of assistantships and out-of-state waivers will have to be devised eventually. Strategies for dealing with the problem of limited numbers of assistantships and out-of-state waivers in the short-term were discussed.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:10 a.m.
