

ASG Minutes
of
October 12, 1982

The regular meeting of the Associated Student Government was called to order by President Margaret Ragan. The minutes of the October 5th meeting were read and approved. Absences included: Mylene Henley, Connie Hoffmann, Dawnelle Marshall, and Thomas Williams.

OFFICER REPORTS

President Margaret Ragan stressed the importance of attendance at committee meetings. She also discussed the stages of reorganization for Associated Student Government:

1. Orientation to committee reorganization
2. Orientation to representative position
3. Rewriting the Constitution

Administrative Vice President Jack Smith said he talked to Terry Willis of the Department of Transportation concerning the traffic count taken September 30 and October 1. The report has been completed but the results were not available, Jack said.

Public Affairs Vice President Kerrie Stewart said her committee is working on a pamphlet and orientation folder for Associated Student Government. She also said that each Congress member will be responsible for an organization and attend at least one meeting a month for that organization, reporting to Kerrie about that organization's complaints or problems.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance Committee Chairperson Kelly Cook said the committee's by-laws are finished.

KISL Chairperson Sandy Carroll said they will be participating in a legislative session in Frankfort. Their bill books are finished with 14 of the 29 bills submitted by Western. Their hayride will be Friday, October 22 at 6:00 p.m. They passed their by-laws.

Legislative Research Committee member Greg Fields said the committee recommends passage of Resolution 82-2, Pass/Fail Discontinuance, with a few changes.

Student Affairs Chairperson Jack Smith reported the results of the Co-ed Housing Poll taken in dorms September 28, and 29. He said 1,288 students voted with 476 females and 640 males saying they favor co-ed housing, and 123 females and 49 males saying they do not.

Student-Faculty Chairperson Claire Groenling said her committee will meet Thursday concerning distribution of discount cards to faculty.

Rules and Elections Chairperson Susan Albert thanked Congress members for working at the polls during the elections.

OLD BUSINESS

Resolution 82-2 had its second reading. There was discussion. *An amendment was made striking last paragraph. Seconded. Passed.* A motion was made to vote immediately. It was seconded. Motion failed. There was further debate.

Bill Borden made a motion to table the resolution 2 weeks until Melody Murphy finds outmore information from the Academic Requirements and Regulations Committee. It was seconded.

An amendment was made changing two weeks to 30 days or until Melody Murphy finds more information. Motion passed.

UCB representative Kelly Smith reported on recent activities: the Alabama Concert will be October 24th in Diddle Arena; Greek Weekend is October 22, 23, and 24; and Barnes Campbell Hall will have a Gong Show October 13th.

Appointments were made to Congress: Senior Class President, Happy Chandler; On-Campus Representative, Rex Hurt; Representative-At-Large, Tom Allen.

Kelly Cook made a motion to accept these appointments. It was seconded. Motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Kelly Cook announced that the SDF Phonathon begins October 17th.

Student Affairs will meet today after the regular meeting.

Tony Whalen made a motion to adjourn. It was seconded. Motion carried.
