

ASG MINUTES
of
November 9, 1982

The regular meeting of the Associated Student Government was called to order by Adm. Vice-President Jack Smith. The minutes of the November 2 meeting were read and approved. Absences included: Bill Dunham, ~~Tim Eckardt~~, Jim Lunsford, ~~Melody Murphy~~, and Laura Robb.

OFFICER REPORTS

Adm. Vice-President Jack Smith said the traffic light for the intersection of University Boulevard and Normal Drive received final approval. It will be installed within two to three months.

Public Affairs Vice-President Kerrie Stewart reported campus activities. She read off a list of names of people who did not fill out press releases.

Academic Affairs Chairperson Melanie Harding said the Pass/Fail Discontinuation was not discussed at the Academic Council meeting.

KISL Chairperson Connie Hoffman said KISL is discussing money - raising projects and plans for next semester.

Legislative Research Committee member Tony Whalen said the committee would like to make a friendly amendment to resolution 82-3, Appropriations for Residence Hall, to include the words "Damage deposit". It was accepted.

Public Relations Chairperson Kerrie Stewart reported on the Traffic Committee. They will be voting at the next meeting on whether to restripe the parking structure.

Student Affairs Chairperson Jack Smith asked Congress members to read the booklet for Alternative Housing. The committee is researching the feasibility of a shuttle service and a caution light in front of Downing University Center.

UCB representative Kelly Smith said their convention in Louisville was last week. The play "The Belle of Amherst" will be at Van Meter Thursday, November 18th at 8:00 p.m. Admission is free.

Inter-Hall Council President Rex Hurt said Parent's Weekend was a success. Vegas III will be Thursday, November 18, 1982 at Garrett Ballroom.

OLD BUSINESS

Resolution 82-3, Appropriations for Residence Halls, had its second reading as amended. A motion was made to vote immediately. It was seconded. Motion carried. The resolution passed.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution 82-4, Alternative Housing, had its first reading.

Resolution 82-5, Discontinuance of WP & WF also had its first reading.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

On-campus representatives will meet after the regular meeting. Student Affairs will meet after the regular meeting. Kerrie Stewart announced that Executive Council nominated Melanie Harding and Ed Jordan for Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities. Jack Smith said the Alternative Housing resolution is the most important piece of legislation thus far this year.
