The majority of the collection features a project conducted by Barbara Church as part of the Community Scholar Survey Grant Program. Instructors in the free six-workshop series taught individuals how to collect and preserve local history, identify and document community traditions, and present these traditions to the public. Participants learned the basic skills needed to help communities explore and showcase local talent, folk traditions, and history. The sessions for this particular program were held every other week from 6 March to 12 June 2004. The Community Scholars Program is a partnership between the Kentucky Folklife Program, the Kentucky Historical Society, and the Kentucky Arts Council.
