Minutes of Executive Committee

June 27, 1932

Members present: Judge Henry B. Hines, Mr. Sterrett Cuthbertson and Dr. H.H. Cherry.

Bids on material for museum cases were presented by Mr. L. T. Smith. Judge Hines moved that we buy the hardwood from Bass & Company, for \$1107.37 who had the lowest bid and the walnut from Wood Mosaic Company who had the lowest bid for \$432.01. The cases are to be made by the Industrial Arts Department. The motion was seconded and carried.

Bids on office supplies were presented. A motion was made to place the orders with the following companies who had the lowest and best bids: Clarence E. Smith Company, \$120.16; Max Potter, \$229.90 and the Meffert Equipment Company \$188.90. Motion seconded and carried.

Bids on hardware were presented. A motion was made and seconded to place the orders with the following: American Hardware Company, \$101.20 and the Warren County Hardware Company \$54.76. There were no bids received from Hollingsworth-Young Company, or Briggs and Aspley.

Bids on Athletic Equipment were received. A motion was made and seconded that the orders be placed with the following firms upon recommendation of Mr. Diddle: Spalding & Company, \$5.50; Warren County Hardware Company, \$1069.59; Lowe and Campbell, \$79.20; Sutcliffe Company \$276.25, and the Athletic Trainers Supply Company \$72.60

Bids for Paint, Varnish, etc., were received. A motion was made and seconded that the orders be placed with the following firms who had the lowest and best bids: Hollingsworth-Young Company, \$26.95; Boetticher and Kellogg \$25.30; Peaslee-Gaulbert Paint and Varnish Company, \$269.50 and the Chas. B. Long Company, \$41.25 Acorn Refining Company \$130.00
