Minutes of Executive Committee

Sept. 12, 1932.

Mr. Cuthbertson moved that the matter of the Library roof be referred to Mr. L. T. Smith.

Judge Hines moved that we accept the engineers recommendation and ask the Purchasing Agent to purchase the washed chestnut coal from the Monroe Warrior Coal and Coke Company.

Judge Hines moved that an order be placed for files for Dr. Jones' office.

Mr. L. T. Smith reported that the floor in the Physical Education Building has been completed. This work was ordered at a previous meeting, not to exceed \$897.00. The work was done for considerable less.

Mr. L. T. Smith submitted an estimate on tables for the Library as follows: 20 walnut tables \$200.00; 2 round tables, \$54.00 and 3 cabinets, \$120.00 Total \$374.00. A motion was made, seconded and carried that Mr. Smith proceed with this work.

Since the number in the band increased, it will be necessary to buy additional uniforms. A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the bid of the Lilley Company for additional uniforms for \$405.85

Dr. Cherry reported he had received the permission of Mr. Sewell, the State Inspector to have the books audited and a balance sheet made for the year ending June 30, 1932 by Escott and Escott for \$200.00. This is \$50.00 less than it has been in previous years.
