Meeting of the Executive Committee

April 6, 1933.

A meeting was called to meet at the Bowling Green Trust Company. Mr. Cuthbertson, Judge Hines and Dr. Cherry present.

The question of buying food supplies from out of the State firms was discussed. A list and amounts purchased from September to March 30 was presented by the secretary. The committee agreed that the local firms should be given special consideration, and that as far as possible, the state firms be favored.

In view of the fact that the amplifier in the Administration Building has been giving considerable trouble, bids from two local firms were presented. Marshall Love and Company and the Farnsworth Electric Company. Marshall Love and Company agreed to build up a set and install it with three years guarantee for the sum of \$290.00. Farnsworth Electric Company offered to sell a Westinghouse outfit for \$700.00 or a Lofton, White set for \$250.00. Mr. Guy Forman, who has charge of operating the set, investigated both propositions thoroughly and recommended the set from Marshall Love Company. A motion was made, seconded and carried to buy the outfit from Marshall Love and Company.

The Committee approved the renewal of the surety bond for the employees handling money, also for the renewal of the workmen's compensation insurance.

A letter was presented from Judge Harlin, lawyer for the J. U. Schickli Company; authorizing the school to issue a check to Robert Coleman, Master Commissioner for \$502.78, to settle the suit of the laborers against J. U. Schickli for the work on the Swimming pool. Approved by the committee.
