

Minutes of Meeting of Executive Committee

May 20, 1933.

Mr. Cuthbertson, Judge Hines were present with Florence Schneider acting as Secretary.

Bids for the laundry work for the pool were opened. The Troy Laundry made a price of .02 $\frac{1}{2}$ on bathing suits and .01 $\frac{1}{2}$ on towels. The Model Laundry made a price of .04 $\frac{1}{2}$ on bathing suits and .0 $\frac{1}{2}$ on towels. The Troy Laundry having the lowest bid was given the contract.

Bids on Athletic supplies were received and tabulated. Mr. Diddle recommended that the following orders be placed. The lowest and best price was considered in every case. These supplies will take care of football for this fall and also some basket ball supplies.
