**CALL TO ORDER**

A regular meeting of the SGA was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Donald Smith.

**OFFICER REPORTS**

Donald Smith, President--President Smith addressed the article in the Herald concerning the SGA rally on November 3. He reported that SGA and USA would be featured on "Word on Western" on October 20. He announced that nine people were going to Weekend in the Woods on October 23-24, and Warren County Judge Executive candidates Buchanon and Miller would be the guest speakers at the October 26 meeting.

Scott Sivley, Administrative Vice-President--Administrative Vice-President Sivley reported that the new SGA constitution will go into effect with the 1994 Spring elections. He announced that the Council on Organizational Affairs will be up for first reading at the October 26 meeting. He reported that ideas for the rally on November 3 included chili supper, speakers, live band, and step show; the rally will run from 8:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m. with coverage from WBKO and area radio stations.

Bert Blevins, Public Relations Vice-President--PR Vice-President Blevins announced that articles for The Gavel were due by October 26.

Andrea Wilson, Secretary--Secretary Wilson reported that there were two Non-Traditional Representative positions open.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS--Chairperson Jennifer Raffaelli reported that the Committee discussed the memo to department heads concerning the Plus System, and the memo should go out by October 22. They discussed getting a list of the names of President's Scholars put in the Herald. They tabled a discussion requiring professors to keep minimum office hours until the next meeting.

LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMITTEE--Chairperson Derrek Duncan encouraged people to write more legislation. He also announced that the Committee would be doing more research.

CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS--Chairperson David Serafini reported that the Committee was researching a second ATM location on campus, and modifying the recycling bin located outside of DUC. Adopt-A-Spot has become a Sub-Committee of Campus Improvements headed by William Zorn.

PUBLIC RELATIONS--Chairperson Emily Brown reported that the Committee had discussed legislation as well as plans for the rally.

First Reading of Bill 93-2-F ORGANIZATIONAL AID RECIPIENTS.


