Therefore, be it resolved that ASU requests that Keen Hall be converted to a program of allowing men and women to live in separate rooms on the same side of the building with each side having a common lobby with locked doors leading into each of the two sides which can only be opened by the students residing in that side of the building. Both sexes will share the common lobby connecting the two sides. The hours of visitation in this hall will be: Sunday thru Thursday 12:00 noon to 11:00 p.m.; Friday and Saturday 12:00 Noon to 2:00 a.m. The check-in policy of the hall will be in line with the status quo of universities using this type of visitation policy (escort and/or no check-in).

Also, be it resolved that WKU Football team now in Keen Hall be given the same opportunity to reside together in other halls as they are now currently given, and

Finally, be it resolved that ASU President/Student Regent Hargrove present this proposal to the WKU administration immediately and to the Board of Regents at their December 1, 1979 meeting.

Whereas, many students at Western Kentucky University desire to have more freedom to visit other students of the opposite sex than any proposal currently being considered by the WKU administration, and

Whereas, WKU's visitation policy is currently one of the most conservative and allows less freedom of choice than most of the thirty-two schools responding to ASG's Housing Operations Survey, and

Whereas, a program of allowing men and women to live in separate building connected by a common lobby has been used with very few problems at other universities,

Therefore, be it resolved that ASG requests that Keen Hall be converted to a residence hall with males on one side and females on the other side. Each side will be separated by the common lobby with locked doors leading into each of the two sides which can only be opened by the students residing in that side of the building. Both sexes will share the common lobby connecting the two sides. The hours of visitation in this hall will be: Sunday thru Thursday 12:00 noon to 11:00 p.m.; Friday and Saturday 12:00 noon to 2:00 a.m. The check-in policy of the hall will be in line with the status-quo of universities using this type of visitation policy (escort and/or no check-in).
