ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

“The Presbyterian Church of Bowling Green” was formed on 9 April 1819 with 27 members, including two African Americans. Under its first pastor, Joseph B. Lapsley, the church was established near the present-day Pioneer Cemetery in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Between the time of Lapsley’s death in 1823 and the destruction of its building by fire about 1831, the church languished. After the arrival of Reverend Samuel Calvert from Tennessee in 1831, however, the church expanded its membership and built a new church building on land donated by James Rumsey Skiles at State and Tenth Streets. Franklin and Mary Kendall Jones, missionaries from Massachusetts, established a school for girls in the basement of the church.

After Samuel Calvert’s death in 1837, doctrinal differences within the Presbyterian Church split the congregation. In November 1839, 33 members withdrew to form the more liberal New School Presbyterian Church under Reverend Archer C. Dickerson, while the remaining 45 members united in the more conservative Old School. The two factions remained divided for the next 19 years but continued to share the church building. In August 1858, the Old School, finding difficulty in supporting its separate existence, reunited with the New School.

Political differences during the Civil War revived the Old School-New School divisions within the church. In 1868, the congregation again split into the First Presbyterian Church (corresponding to the Old School) and the Second Presbyterian Church (corresponding to the New School). The Second Presbyterian Church built its own building at the corner of Center and Eighth Streets and became known as the “Pine Knot Church.”

In 1888, the Second Presbyterian Church accepted an offer to reunite with the First Presbyterian Church. Its property was sold and the proceeds used to expand the church at State and Tenth Streets.

COLLECTION NOTE

The collection consists primarily of the photocopied session minutes of the Presbyterian Church of Bowling Green, Kentucky, from 1819 to 1906. Session Book 1 (Box 1, Folder 2) covers 1819-1858 and includes minutes of the New School Presbyterian Church from 1839-1858). A typescript of Session Book 1 is also in the collection (Box 1, Folder 2a).

Session Book 1-A (Box 1, Folder 3) covers 1819-1862 and includes minutes of the Old School Presbyterian Church from 1839-1858. (Session Book 1-A is so designated because after the church split into the two schools, the clerk of the New School retained the original session book and the clerk of the Old School began by recopying the first 20 years of church minutes into this book.) A duplicate copy of Session Book 1-A, which in some cases provides more readable copies of certain pages, is in Box 1, Folder 3a.

Box 2 contains Session Book 2 covering 1861-1867 (Folder 1); Session Book 3 covering 1868-1888 (Folders 2 and 3); and session minutes covering 1889-1906 (Folders 4 and 5). These books include members lists as well as lists of elders, deacons, marriages, baptisms and deaths.

Also included (Box 2, Folder 6) is a consolidated index of church members prepared by the church history committee and covering 1819-1888. This index includes membership in the various church factions for that period, together with a citation to the session book in which the information appears. It should be noted that this index also contains the names of members of the Bowling Green Cumberland Presbyterian Church from 1866-1884 as listed in the first session book of that church. (The Cumberland Presbyterian Church was organized on 12 August 1866 and a church building was constructed at the corner of Center and Eleventh Streets in Bowling Green.)
