ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

In 1813 a Union Church, for all Protestants, was established near Quality in Butler County, Kentucky. In 1834 the Baptist members of this congregation agreed to organize a Baptist church calling themselves, by 1839, the United Baptist Church of Christ at Concord. In 1842 the members decided to build a church at Rock Spring, although the congregation continued to meet in members' homes until the construction was completed in 1844. Amos Russ was called as first pastor. The current church was constructed in 1870 on land donated by Ephraim and Sarah Knight, replacing the original log structure. It was remodeled in 1975.
