MINUTES

UNIVERSITY CENTER BOARD

September 2, 1987

The first meeting of the fall semester of University Center Board was called to order on Wednesday, September 2, 1987, at 30:30 p.m. in Room 226 of the Downing University Center.

The roll was called with 16 members present.

REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS

Associated Student Government

Representative Tim Todd reported that ASG's first meeting was held last night, during which their new congress was sworn in. There were only 10 vacant chairs, and many freshmen attended. Tim also reported that Weekend In The Woods will be held Sept. 25 through Sept. 27.

Inter-Hall Council

Panhellenic

Representative Melinda York reported that a pledge picnic took place on Lampkin Park on Sept. 1. Five sororities reached their quota, including Sigma Kappa. The Panhellenic retreat will be held Sept. 12 at the Holidome.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Chairman Tim Harper welcomed everyone back. He announced that Bill Gorman is filling in as Lecture Chairperson in place of Penny Barwick, who is working on her internship in Louisville. Penny will return in the spring.

Brooks Walthall, the new manager of Niteclass, was introduced. Brooks is from Central Arkansas and has a background in disc jockeying.

Vice Chairman Leanne Banna announced that UCB's recruitment program will be different this year than in the past. A promotional letter will be sent to the students, and those interested will be contacted later.

STANDING COMMITTEES

Contemporary Music

Chairman Tommy Harper reported that Otis Day will play on Sept. 11, from 9:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. in the Garrett Ballroom. The Janitors will be the opening act. Tickets for students

will cost \$5; the general public will be charged \$6. The tickets will sell starting today through next Friday on the DUC patio from 11:30 until 2:00. This concert will cost UCB approximately \$8,500 to put on. Tommy also reported that KILO will be playing Sept. 15 at 8:00 in the DUC Grill. This concert cost \$1,500, of which about \$150 went toward promoting the concert in the Herald.

Lecture

Chairman Bill Gorman reported that the "Violence in Sports" lecture will take place on Sept. 14 in DUC. Bill also reported that Sandra Gallant will be here on Oct. 26, and Pete Best will speak Dec. 8.

Production

Public Relations

Chairperson Lindsay Mosser reported that the Wild Video Bash which was sponsored by Domino's Pizza was a success.

Special Events

Chairman Curtis Barman reported that 1,800 to 2,000 people showed up for the Wild Video Bash. Curtis also reported that Game Show Madness will take place on Sept. 22; the Organizational Fair on Sept. 29; Hilloween on Oct. 28. At Hilloween a recording booth will be available. Big Red's Roar will be on Oct. 15, and College Bowl will take place during the first week of November. Hanging of the Green will be Dec. 9. Curtis also reported that the Special Events Committee's first meeting took place yesterday, and it went well.

PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Bennie Beach asked that the committee chairpersons put together their job-description manuals. He also needs to know their office hours. Mr. Beach is hoping for a good crowd at the Otis Day concert, as well as for Game Show Madness, which will have free admission. Mr. Beach announced that Brooks Walthall will be working closely with the Special Events Committee, Public Relations, and Concert Committee. UCB will utilize the Hangout through Mr. Walthall, the way they have utilized DUC's rooms in the past.

NEW BUSINESS

The first presentation of Budget Proposal 87-F-1 took place. The increase consisted of \$25,000. It was moved and seconded to propose the budget increase. The floor was opened for discussion. It was announced that the Concert Committee will

receive an increase of \$5,000 which will allow for the booking of better bands. Tommie Harper stated that this increase will mean WKU can afford to host more bands from Nashville. Bennie Beach announced that the figures in the budget proposal were based on past needs and expenditures. Tim Harper announced that in the past certain committees had exceeded their budgets, while others had spent less than they had been allotted. Therefore, their budgets were evened out to suit their needs. \$1,000 was added to the funding of Big Red's Roar, since it has exceeded its budget the past two years. \$10,000 has been allotted for events to take place every other week in the Hangout. Special Events and Concert will have jurisdiction over how the money is spent. Proposals for these events will be conducted just like the formal proposals which take place in the Administrative Council meetings.

Dean Bailey said that the money for the Hangout events will be set to a location and channelled through the same committees that would normally handle each event. Tim Harper stressed the importance of being conservative with this increase.


A roll call vote was taken to accept the budget as stated. The proposal was unanimously passed.
