Pickens came to Western in the fall of 1965 after a sparkling coaching career in the high school ranks, where he fashioned championship teams in both baseball and football. In six seasons at Bowling Green High School, his baseball teams won 118 games while losing only 20, a percentage of .855. He climaxed his coaching stint there by guiding the Purples to the State Championship in 1965.

Before coaching at Bowling Green, Pickens held similar positions at Danville and Elizabethtown High Schools. Over a 15-year span, his high school teams won 221 victories against just 59 losses, a .789 percentage.

After suffering through three rather lean seasons in rebuilding Western's baseball fortunes, Pickens' last four Hilltopper clubs have been among the most respected in the OVC. His 1969 team won the Western Division championship.

Pickens' overall Western record, going into the 1973 campaign, shows 107 wins, 99 losses and three ties.

In addition to his coaching duties, Pickens is Director of University Centers. He received the B.S. and M.A. degrees from Western in 1951 and 1962, respectively.

BUCK SYDNOR
Assistant Coach



Buck Sydnor is starting his second season as assistant baseball coach. He became Jim Pickens' assistant coach in the spring of 1972 after spending six seasons as a basketball assistant coach under John Oldham.

Sydnor, a star on Western's first two National Invitation Tournament basketball teams in 1942 and 1943, joined the Western staff in 1964.

Buck was a veteran of 15 years of high school basketball coaching at Daviess County, Hopkinsville, and Bowling Green High Schools when he came to Western.

His Hilltopper basketball freshmen, over six seasons (1965-71), won 62 and lost 50 while playing some of the toughest schedules ever faced by the Western frosh.

Sydnor received his B.S. and M.A. degrees from Western Kentucky in 1948 and 1949, respectively.

1973 OUTLOOK

Coach Jim Pickens is very optimistic about his team having an outstanding 1973 spring season.

Discussing his team's chances of an Ohio Valley Conference Western Division title, Coach Pickens said, "This team has the best overall balance we have had since I came here. In the past, we had good hitting, but no pitching, or the other way around. If this team plays the level of ball they are capable of playing, we can compete with anybody."

Western's baseball schedule has been expanded and the Toppers are now playing a fall schedule in addition to the annual spring slate. Under this new system, the Hilltoppers played six conference games last fall and will play six more this spring.

Last fall, Western finished with a 3-3 record in conference play, tying Austin Peay for second place, two games behind Murray State in the OVC's Western Division. The Hilltoppers finished with a 10-6 overall record and Pickens rates this a successful start.

During the fall schedule, the team batted .298 and posted an earned run average of 2.01. Commenting on those statistics, Pickens said, "This team fundamentally is sound; my boys can hit, pitch, and field. If our kids can maintain the offense and pitching we had this fall, and hopefully improve in some areas, we could be a championship team."

A strong pitching staff is led by sophomore Jeff Ralph and freshman Lewis Key. Ralph has won three games without a defeat, while Key has allowed only three earned runs in 22 2/3 innings, an earned run average of 1.19. Other standouts have been Dave Mullendore, a freshman from Bowling Green, and juniors Greg Stahl and Mike Grubb.

The men that swing the big bats are led by outfielder Steve Long, who got 20 hits in 45 times at bat for a .444 average; sophomore Steve Keck, who batted .371; and Steve Tate, a junior who hit .356 last fall.

The only player on the spring roster who did not play in the fall is Leo Peckenpaugh. During the autumn months, Leo is the starting quarterback on the varsity football squad. Pickens remarked, "Leo, a pitcher and outfielder, is a competitor, and swings a good bat for us. He is a tough out at the plate and is a sound college ballplayer."

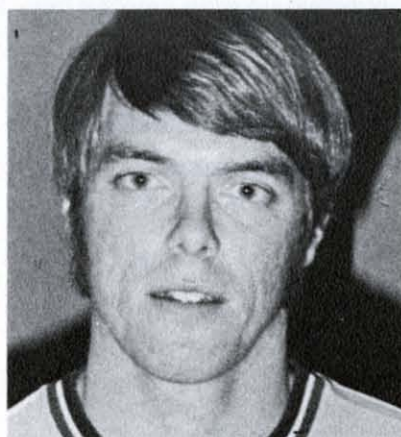
