COLLECTION NOTE

This collection consists primarily of research collected by Dr. James M. Gifford of Morehead State University for a history of the John C. Campbell Folk School, established in 1925 in Brasstown, North Carolina. The school grew out of the Appalachian studies of John C. Campbell (1867-1919) and his wife Olive Dame Campbell (1882-1954) and was modeled on the folk schools that had long been part of rural life in Denmark. After John died in 1919, Olive and school co-founder Marguerite Butler (later Marguerite Butler Bidstrup) visited Europe to learn more about the folk school movement. Upon their return they selected a location for the school in southwestern North Carolina. They built the school with the enthusiastic help of local citizens, who donated labor and building materials. The John C. Campbell Folk School offers no credits or grades, but rather seeks to offer an alternative to higher education that preserves the unique history, crafts and folklife of the Appalachian region and its people.

Box 1 contains research material on the school and on John C. Campbell and Olive Dame Campbell. Much of the material consists of articles and speeches about the school and related topics by Olive Dame Campbell and Marguerite Butler; also included are feature articles and reports on the school, its curriculum and activities that appeared in publications such as *Southern Mountain Life and Work* (soon renamed *Mountain Life and Work*), as well as in the school's own bulletins.

Box 2 contains additional research material on the school and its administrators, including correspondence (which begins in 1924, as Olive Dame Campbell explores the possibility of establishing the school), a World War II-era newsletter giving news of many alumni in military service, and calendars. Also included is more general research on the folk school movement, festivals, conferences, and rural life and work; much of this research is again collected from articles in publications such as *Mountain Life and Work*. A few materials on the Brasstown Women's Community Club detail its work and its relationship with the school. Notes and local history research gathered from members of the community, apparently in the 1930s, feature some genealogy and folklore.
