The book chronicles the career of U.S. Attorney General (1913-1914) and Associate Supreme Court Justice (1914-1941) James Clark McReynolds, a native to Todd County, Kentucky. A political conservative, McReynolds opposed many of the New Deal's programs and policies. This book examines "the use and abuse of executive power to establish policies and organizations that were later struck down as unconstitutional by the Court, and reveals how the door was opened to create an imbalance of the original powers that govern our nation."
